

AK Strong: Anielle McEwan-Lomnicki, set to do the famous "Do or Die Shot"

NORWICH - After a two-month recovery period, Sidney student-athlete Anielle McEwan-Lomnicki, who goes by "AK" will be making a special appearance in the 2023 Norwich Gus Macker as a special guest and as a play-

In mid-February, AK, 14, was walking home from school when she was struck by a drunk driver. She spent seven weeks in the hospital, fighting for her life while her father, Rich Lomnicki, updated everyone each day on her progress through social media. A Facebook group called 'AK Strong' was created as well, where many offered their thoughts and prayers.

Since her hospital stay and her return home from the hospital in early April, AK was able to return to school and slowly get back into playing basketball. She is also thankful for everyone's support.

"I've been really happy to be home and felt like I'm getting back to my life. I've had some frustrating moments, but I'm getting better and stronger every day. I thank my friends and family, everyone that prayed for me, and my doctors for all the support," AK said.

Gus Macker celebrates 26 years in Norwich

NORWICH - The 3 on 3 Gus Macker Tournament is set to return for its 26th year in Norwich on July 8 and 9. The event also returns to the Norwich High School for its second year after a pre-planned two-year construction work project affecting the downtown area.

After a lot of changes made last year, including location, the tournament continues to be the same beloved event of the summer, bringing the community together since the start in 1996.

Norwich is currently the largest and longest running tournament in New York State. It is also expected to be the longest running tournament in the nation next year after one host city in Belding, after 30 years.

varsity teams honored AK, including her own Sidney Warriors. Special pins with her picture and words "Pray for AK" were distributed around several local gymnasiums, including at Oxford High School. Several players wore these pins in support of AK for the remainder of the season.

Donations were also collected to support AK and her family during the difficult time. At the 2023 MAC basketball championship, held at Unadilla Valley, the event raised \$1,371. Aside from this event, many other local businesses sold items to proceed AK as well.

AK's basketball started in career where she school, didn't know until later

that it would become an interest that she would continue.

During this time, she also realized she was good at playing, so her parents signed up for an overnight basketball camp. The overnight basketball camp at Houghton College only made AK a better player, leading to her getting an invite to try out for AAU basketball and was accepted.

The rest is history, AK said, as she has been on the Sidney girls' basketball team since before her incident, and hopes to rejoin this upcoming winter season.

Since her recovery, she's been at some AAU practices and has been practicing at home. She has also been medically cleared to play in this year's Gus Macker Tournament, where she is captain of

and Norwich staff is introduced. It is a silly game where the special guest, who Tom Revoir calls a "celebrity in the town," shoots a shot or many shots. If they make the shot, the tournament goes on. If not, the tournament is over and everyone packs up and leaves.

But, that never happens as they're allowed as many shots as it takes to make it in. Revoir also says that it is a great and fun way to kick-off the tournament that even gets people pumped up.

With AK making this special appearance, it only shows how much she means to everyone who prayed and followed her journey.

Registration Procedures

SPORTSMAN: A person who can take loss or defeat without complaint, or victory without gloating, & who treats his opponents with fairness, generosity, courtesy, etc.

GOOD SPORTS

DO....keep their teammates under control.

DO....keep their Coaches & Parents under control.

DO....help out the game official by telling him/her they did a nice job.

(remember, they are volunteers)

DO....play hard, have fun and enjoy the weekend.

GOOD SPORTS

DO NOT....use inappropriate language towards game officials or anyone on or around the court. (remember, your brothers, sisters, sons, daughters, Mom and Dad are sitting around the court watching and listening to you).

DO NOT....try to hurt an opponent, fan or Game Official by physical roughness or trash talking or intentional fouling.

We all have something to do on Monday, whether it's going to work, or school, enjoying vacation or the numerous other activities that occupy our busy summer schedules. NO ONE NEEDS TO BE INJURED. So be a GOOD SPORT, keep it clean and have fun.

FORMAT

Registration will be by Court Assignment. Captains, please inform your teammates.

IDENTIFICATION

Identification is required at registration.

Sources that can be used are:

•Birth Certificate (4-15 yrs. old)

Drivers License (16 & above)

·School ID with birthdate, etc.

Your identification MUST be with you at ALL TIMES

MEASURING

All players will be measured at registration to verify information provided on the original application.

WAIVER

Every player must sign a liability waiver. Those 17 and under MUST have a parent/guardian sign with them. A copy is provided online or at registration.

BRACELET

Each player is required to wear an identification bracelet on their wrist at all times. This bracelet will be put on by a volunteer at registration after ID is checked and a waiver is signed. The bracelet must be worn the entire weekend; it is not removable.

Weather Policy · Teams are responsible to hear announcement

Adverse weather conditions & unplayable situations may result in the following (in order of decision-making process):

- 1. Delay of games for a period of time until the clouds break and conditions improve. (May also require moving games from scheduled courts to overflow courts or others not in use, and/or eliminate certain aspects such as Toilet Bowl, etc.).
- 2. Reduce the number of points required to win a game.
- Play games on a consecutive basis by game number rather than by the pre-established game times.
- 4. Change the format of the tournament from double to single elimination.
- Move the tournament to indoor site within a reasonable distance of the original site if available.
- 6. Re-schedule the tournament for a later date at the same site.
- 7. Cancel the tournament.

In the unlikely event of cancellation of the tournament due to adverse weather conditions, each team shall receive their four (4) players t-shirts and team registration package (i.e. programs, Gusettes, etc.) Every effort will also be made to present trophies and awards in an equitable manner. Under no circumstances will a team receive a full cash refund of the team entry fee. The exact amount of the refund is at the sole discretion of the tournament organizers, considering the number of games played, out of pocket costs, etc. The maximum cash refund, if any, will be \$20.00 per team.

SPECIAL NOTE: Teams must be at their court at the scheduled time, even if games are "running behind". If games are "running behind" for any reason (inclement weather, slow play, etc.) the final point of reference for scheduling or re-scheduling procedures shall be the Bracket Tent; not any verbal information provided by a Game Official. The players are ultimately responsible for obtaining accurate scheduling information and being at their court to play when their game is to begin. Game time is forfeit time.





The Norwich Family YMCA is excited to be hosting the 26th Norwich Gus Macker three on three basketball tournament on July 8-9, 2023.

We are proud of our long history with Gus Macker and using basketball as a tool to bring people together. Although an event to support the Norwich YMCA, this event is ultimately opportunity to support our community through tourism, overnight stays, fundraising, and an opportunity to bring youth and families together.

Who would have thought that twenty-eight years after initiating a Gus Macker in Norwich, that we would still be here, playing three on three basketball. During those twenty-eight years, we soon became the longest tenured Gus Macker tournaments in New York State, while growing to be the one of the largest Gus Macker's in New York State. We were informed that Ludington, Michigan will no longer host a Gus Macker after 2023, therefore making Norwich, New York the longest running Gus Macker in the United States.

Hosting a tournament of this size, for so many years, does not come easy. We pride ourselves on offering a quality tournament for all that participate and visit the Norwich tournament. Our entire community literally assists in hosting and welcoming countless visitors throughout upstate New York and many former residents as they return home to Norwich.

An event of this size is not possible without the support of a whole community. The City of Norwich has been instrumental from day one: Police and Fire support, logistical support with the Department of Public Works, Emergency Management support with our Mass Gather permit with New York State and more. Countless community volunteers work together across multiple work disciples to assure we are prepared and ready to host an estimated 1000 basketball players between the ages of 5 and 55 this year.

We are thankful to our friends at the Norwich City School District for allowing us to utilize their School Campus again as we wait for the City streets to be repaved in downtown Norwich. Your support has allowed us to keep this summer tradition alive in Norwich. Our volunteers are second to none. The Macker event takes the whole community to support this massive undertaking and we are proud of our diverse group of volunteers who strive to offer a quality event for all.

As you look through the "Gusette" print edition, look at the amazing sponsors who continually support the YMCA in bringing "Macker" to Norwich. Your dedication allows us to offer basketball to over 1000 players, over 300 volunteers and thousands of families and spectators cheering, applauding and supporting their players. We are blessed to have this amazing tradition.

Macker teams, thank you for returning to Norwich. We realize you have the option to play or watch and you chose to play, even with everything else going on in our communities and the rising gas prices too.

The one thing that has been constant with the Norwich Gus Macker is that the event is centered around our youth players, focuses on charity, promotes Norwich, and showcasing the amazing volunteers who organize and implement this amazing community event, while highlighting the "good" that Norwich has to offer, while putting us on the basketball map.

Don't Forget Your Waiver Form and Identification

Captains receiving their Gusette in the mail will receive a waiver form. There will also be waiver forms at the registration. All participants must turn in a signed waiver form and players under 18 must have the waiver signed by a parent or guardian. Identification such as birth certificates (under 15 yrs. old), driver's license (16 & above), or school ID with birthdate is needed.

Registered Officials on all Courts Program

possession of the ball will go to the other team. If the ball is not "taken back" and then advanced, any other violation, common foul, offensive foul, intentional, flagrant or technical foul called by the official will be honored. Exception: If a player is fouled in the act of shooting and makes the basket prior to properly "taking it back" the foul will be honored; however, no points will be awarded.

- 9. NEW! 10-Second Rule. When taking the ball out-of-bounds, a player shall have ten (10) seconds to put the ball into play. A player shall also have ten (10) seconds to initiate any free throw attempt. In either case, the Official is responsible for determining when a violation occurs, which will result in loss of possession of the ball.
- 10. Any infraction of these regulations will result in loss of possession of the ball.

FOULS AND FREE THROWS

- NEW! <u>All</u> Shooting fouls will be handled in the following manner:
 - A. When the basket is made count the basket and whether the ensuing free throw is made or missed, possession goes to the defensive team.
 - B. When the basket is missed if the free throw is made, possession goes to the defensive team. If the free throw is missed, the offensive team retains possession.
 - **NOTE:** One (1) free-throw will be awarded to the fouled player, even if fouled in the act of attempting a shot from behind the 2-point line.
- 2. Non-shooting fouls on and after the 7th team foul will be handled in the following manner:
 - A. If the free throw is made, possession goes to the defensive team.
 - **B.** If the free throw is missed, the offensive team retains possession.
 - **C.** If a foul is committed as time runs out, a free throw will be awarded to the fouled player.
- 3. All free throws are dead balls.
- 4 FREE THROW OPTION: in any free throw situations, (including technical fouls), the designated shooter may at his or her option choose to shoot from the free-throw line for one (1) point, OR from behind the 2 point line for 2 points. In either case, the player shooting must have both feet completely behind the line when initiating and completing the attempt. If the 2 point shot is chosen, the non-shooting team will be awarded the ball regardless of whether the shot is successful or not (Exception: Technical Fouls).
- 5. All technical fouls will be counted as a team foul.

TECHNICAL FOULS - PLAYER MISCONDUCT, FLAGRANT AND INTENTIONAL FOULS

- DEFINITION: The Official may assess a <u>Technical Foul</u> for any misconduct, flagrant, or intentional fouls committed by a player(s). This may include:
 - · A Contact Foul intended to hurt an opponent, fan or Official
 - · Vulgar or verbally abusive behavior
 - Other misconduct deemed inappropriate by the Official (e.g. intentionally kicking the ball, etc....) or a contact foul

- designed to neutralize an opponent's obvious advantageous position.
- 2. PENALTY: A choice between two (2) Free Throws from the Free Throw Line (15-ft.) for one (1) point each, <u>OR</u> two (2) shots from behind the 2 point line for 2 points each will be awarded to the offended team. In either case, the player shooting must have both feet completely behind the line when initiating and completing the attempt.
 - · The Team Captain may designate the player to shoot.
 - The Offended Team will retain possession of the ball whether the shots are made or missed.
 - Any player committing two (2) Technical Fouls in a game is automatically ejected from that game and his/her teams' next game.
- Fighting and/or 'Throwing a Punch' automatically results in a Technical Foul assessed against the players(s) involved. Free Throws will be awarded as described above and will result in immediate dismissal of the player(s) from the tournament.
- A Technical Foul will be counted as a Team Foul.
- Continuous misconduct, intentional and or flagrant fouling by a team or player may result in dismissal from the game or tournament at the discretion of the Official or other Tournament Official.
- Any player ejected from a Gus Macker Tournament for misconduct, intentional and/or flagrant fouling, fighting or throwing a punch, will be automatically banned from participation in future Gus Macker Tournaments for a period of one (1) year.
- 7. NEW! Misconduct by a player and/or team while playing in their final game of the tournament or after already being eliminated from competition in the tournament, and/or while acting as a 'spectator' at another game(s), may jeopardize that player and/or team from further participation in that tournament and/or future Macker Tournaments, at the discretion of tournament officials.

MISCELLANEOUS

- 1. All women's divisions and 10 and under age divisions will use the intermediate size basketball.
- No alcoholic beverage will be allowed for player consumption on-site.
- 3. HIV/AIDS The Game Official, SuperBuster, HeadBuster, Gus Macker Officials, or Medical Personnel shall order any player who is bleeding or has blood on his/her skin, shirts, shorts or uniform to leave the game for appropriate treatment. The player may not return until the bleeding has been stopped, the injury covered with medical dressing and the player's clothing is rid of any bloodstains. Re-entry into the game will be at the discretion of the Official. Return to the game must take place on a deadball situation.
- The Team Captain is always the team spokesperson, not a coach, parent, spectator, or one of the other players. We ask that all coaches and parents play "the role of a spectator only".
- NEW! Jewelry (earrings, rings, watches, etc...), hats, bandanas, and/or casts are not allowed to be worn by players during tournament games. Any player that refuses to remove any such item prior to play, is not eligible to participate in that game.

Tournament Guidelines



ATTENTION PARENTS & COACHES

This event is designed for all ages. Gus Macker and your local organizers want all participating youth and adults to have a positive, fun experience. In order for this to happen we ask that all coaches and parents play a spectator's role only.

Please note that inappropriate language and/or behavior directed at players or officials will not be tolerated. Only one warning will be given. If the incident reoccurs, the adult involved will be asked to leave. Please help make this a positive event. Thank you in advance for your cooperation; we look forward to seeing you.

PLAYER INFORMATION & ELIGIBILITY

- Each team must have four (4) players on their roster and be registered as a team by the predetermined entry deadline.
 Additions and/or changes on rosters will not be permitted under any circumstance after the entry deadline.
- Players may appear on only one (1) team roster for each tournament.
 Any player appearing on more than one (1) team roster may be disqualified from participation in that tournament.
- As a general rule, teams are split into male and female divisions by computer analysis considering the average age, experience, and height of the players. Co-ed teams will automatically be scheduled in a male division using this same criteria.
- 4. Identification for each player (e.g. birth certificate, drivers license, other photo ID, etc...) is required at on-site registration to verify information provided on the original team application (i.e. age, height, experience). ID bracelets will be issued at that time. The ID bracelet must be worn at all times to participate in a Macker contest. Players must be prepared to show identification throughout the tournament weekend.
- 5. If any of a player's personal information listed on the team application is inaccurate (e.g. age, height, experience), the player will be eliminated from participation in the tournament. Discovery at any time after registration of the player in question may also result in elimination of the whole team from further competition.
- Eligibility problems will be enforced from point of discovery. No replay
 of games or adjustments will be allowed for previous contests and
 standing involving the team in question.
- 7. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN FOR ANY REASON!!!

PLAYER SUBSTITUTION POLICY

ON or BEFORE THE ORIGINAL ENTRY DEADLINES:

. Player substitutions can be made as long as they are mailed and/or submitted online by the original postmark/online deadlines for that tournament. A form can be mailed to: Player Substitutions, 107 E. Main St., Belding, MI 48809

NOTE: Teams that signed up originally through the online registration process can make roster changes before the entry deadline at no extra cost using their password provided when they registered.

*Some tournaments may limit the number of teams that participate in a particular event. In that case, if the tournament has reached its limit prior to the original entry deadlines, the earlier date will be the 'cut-off' for this player substitution policy.

AFTER THE ORIGINAL ENTRY DEADLINE

Teams are allowed to make two (2) player substitutions not (1) after the entry deadline under the following guidelines:

- The substitution must be received in the Macker office in Belding no later than 5:00 pm (EST) on the Wednesday prior to the tournament weekend.
- A substitution form (available by calling the Macker office at 616-794-1445 or online at www.macker.com) must be faxed to 616-794-1472 or submitted online by Wednesday as stated above in number 1 (we will not accept forms sent by regular mail after the original entry deadline).
- The 'new' player added to the roster must be the same age, same height or shorter, and have the same or less playing experience as the replaced player. Gus Macker reserves the right to deny any substitution

that does not meet these requirements.

- 4. A processing fee of \$25.00 is to be paid only by credit card when submitting the substitution form (no other form of payment will be accepted). Note: If the credit card payment is declined for any reason, the substitution will not be allowed.
- Macker Headquarters will email you a formal confirmation that your substitution has been approved.

Division Breakdown

JUNIOR DIVISIONS (18 years of age and below)

As a general rule, teams are placed into male and female divisions according to pre-established age categories, as follows:

10 & Under 11-12 13-14 15-16 17-18

Any co-ed teams registered to play will automatically be schedule in a male division based on criteria listed above.

- The age of the players is determined as of Saturday of the event weekend.
- To ensure proper placement of team, all four (4) players must fit
 within the established age category. If a player does not meet the age
 requirement, your team will be placed into the category of the oldest
 player.

SPECIAL NOTE: Every effort will be made to place teams into these age categories. Gus Macker will change or combine age categories only when not enough teams have entered to complete an age division. In a few instances, Gus Macker may have to create co-ed within these age categories.

ADULT DIVISIONS (Ages 19 & Over)

As a general rule, Adult teams are computer-matched into divisions according to average age, height and playing experience of all four (4) players. Most divisions will have between 16-20 teams.

30 AND OVER DIVISIONS

Teams will be placed into pre-established age brackets as follows:

30-34 35-39 40 & Over

- The age of the players is determined as of Saturday of the event weekend.
- To ensure proper placement of your team, please make sure that all four (4) players fit the established age category.
- If a player does not meet the age requirement, your team will be placed into the category of your youngest player.

SPECIAL NOTE: Every effort will be made to place teams into these age categories. Gus Macker will change or combine age categories only when not enough teams have entered to complete an age division.

TOP DIVISIONS (Most experienced level of play) Eligibility of Amateur Athletes:

- Gus Macker is not responsible for players violating state high school or NCAA
 rules
- Prep Athletes (Jr. High & High School)
 As a general rule, interscholastic basketball players are eligible to participate in Gus Macker tournaments. Players should, however, check with their Coach/

Athletic Director to ensure compliance with your state's rules and regulations. **College:**

Current intercollegiate basketball players are permitted to participate in Gus Macker Tournaments held between June 15 and August 31. A letter from the athlete's college or university's athletic department must be sent to Gus Macker granting permission to participate in a Macker event. In addition, no more than one player from any one college team can appear on a Macker roster.

NOTE: There are no restrictions on the participation of Division III student-athletes in outside basketball competition during the summer. Also, the player limitation from any one college team does NOT apply to Division II or Division III student-athletes.





Neighborhood Rules & Regulations



Registered Officials on all Courts Program

PRE-GAME

- 1. All games may start and be completed with any number of players (3,2,1).
- Both teams will warm-up at the same time prior to the start of the game.
- Only those teams scheduled to play are allowed to occupy the court at the scheduled time.
- 4. Teams must be at their court at the scheduled game time, even if games are "running behind" for any reason (inclement weather, slow play, etc...). The final point of reference for scheduling procedures shall be the Bracket Area, not verbal information provided by a Game Official or SuperBuster. The players are ultimately responsible for obtaining accurate scheduling information and being at their court to play when their game is to begin. Game time is forfeit time. Information given by the Game Official or SuperBuster is not final.
- 5. **SPECIAL NOTE:** Gus suggests that you be at your court 15 minutes before the scheduled game time and stay there until your game is played.
- No dunking allowed warm ups or games. Any participant registered to play in the Gus Macker tournament observed dunking on any basket at any time may be dismissed from the tournament. Entry fee will not be refunded. (Exception – Slam Dunk Contest)
- 7. **Note:** Dunking is allowed on the Top Men's and Top Women's divisions during games only. **NOT** during warm-ups.

REGISTERED OFFICIALS DUTIES

- The Official will call all fouls and violations.
- 2. One (1) Official assigned per court.
- 3. The Official has absolute authority to control play on his or her court, including the right to 'sit' a player for a period of time, eject a player(s) from a game or games, and/or eject a player(s) from the tournament. Higher authority cannot change the judgment decisions of the Official. Only questions concerning rule interpretation are appealable.
- 4. <u>NOTE:</u> Even though it is not required, Gus suggests that the Official check with the HeadBuster or a Macker Staff member regarding ejection of a player from a tournament.
- Once play resumes after a disagreement or appeal, the decision is considered to be final. No further appeals will be allowed on that incident.

OFFICIAL GAME TIME

- 1. Game Time is Forfeit Time.
- 2. "One Hour Rule" Any game(s) that begins more than one hour after the original scheduled time, the game winning scores will be reduced by five (5) points, until a time where games begin within one hour of the scheduled start time. The rule will be applied on a court by court basis. The HeadBuster or Gus Macker Staff will have the authority to implement its use. (This rule will be utilized under certain circumstances, due to slow play).

TIME LIMIT/SCORING

- 1. A field goal is worth 1 point.
- 2. Asuccessfulgoalfrombehindadesignatedline (approximately 16'9") is worth 2 points. The player shooting must have both feet completely behind the line when initiating the attempt.
- 3. The following scoring rules apply for the Neighborhood:
 - A. Winner Bracket Games -15 points win by 2, up to a maximum of 20 points. (example: 15-13, 18-16, 20-19).
 - B. Loser Bracket Games -15 points win by 2, up to a maximum of 20 points. (example: 15-13, 18-16, 20-19).
 - C. Toilet Bowl Games 15 points straight-out.
- All games (Adult & Junior) will have a 25-minute time limit.
 The official starting time will be recorded by the Official on the score sheet. The official time will be under the jurisdiction of the Official. (The "clock" will be stopped only during timeouts regular and/or injury.)
- The team leading at the end of 25 minutes will be declared the winner.
- 6. If the game is tied after 25 minutes of play and no team has reached the required number of points to win the game, the Official will flip a coin to determine team possession. The first team to score will win the game
- 7. If a team wins their 1st game by forfeit and loses their next 2 games they are eligible to advance to the Toilet Bowl.

TIME-OUTS AND SUBSTITUTIONS

- Each team is allowed one (1) one minute time-out per game.
 Exception: 40 and over division is allowed two (2) one minute time-outs per game.
- 2. If play is stopped by a teammate or the Official to attend to an obvious injury, then the injured player must sit out at least until the next dead ball.
- 3. Player substitution is permitted during any dead ball situation.

LIVE BALL / DEAD BALL / POSSESSION

- A coin flip before the start of the game will determine who gets the ball out-of-bounds first.
- The ball will change possession after each scored basket (i.e. no possession/no make it take it).
- Jump balls will be called by the Official and will go to the defense. (Not alternating possession)
- 4. The top, bottom and sides of the backboard are in play; however, the back of the backboard and the support structure of the basket are not in play.
- 5. The ball must be checked by an opposing player before it is put into play. The player must pass the ball in while standing out-of-bounds at the top of the court to begin play.
- 6. All fouls and violations will be played out-of-bounds at the top of the court.
- 7. A ball out-of-bounds will be taken out at the top of the court.
 - The ball must be "taken back" to the marked line on the court on every change of possession. "Taking back" means both feet and the ball behind the take back line. Violation occurs only if a basket is made by the team failing to properly "take it back", and will result in loss of point scored and

also hurt participation numbers in the recent Macker years and across the nation.

Participation

In the tournament's return to Norwich in 2022, The YMCA and Gus Macker committee welcomed 210 teams, reflecting the first year numbers, and 22 courts were placed among the Norwich High School campus.

tournament The once saw over 500 teams by the fifth year in 2001, but have since capped the numbers at a stable 400. The YMCA admits that the numbers in recent years have been at a decrease since the start, but appreciates more the quality of the event over quantity.

The registration fee also increased this year from \$160 to \$180 to reflect an increase in costs for the YMCA to

receive the baskets and other Macker related expenses to make sure the tournament is set to go on.

While the costs went up, this did not hurt participation numbers. In fact, numbers improved greatly from 2022 to now.

This year, teams piled up right by June 21, the first deadline, which then closed the registration link with no need to extend. Tom Revoir, the YMCA's Sports Coordinator and one of Norwich's Macker directors, said a lot of teams are typically late on signing up with a majority coming on the day of registration.

deadline, there were 157 teams signed up. Revoir and Jamey Mullen, the YMCA's **Executive Director and** other Norwich Macker director, kept track of the number of teams through the admin-

Mullen and Revoir said that these numbers reflect the outcome of advertising of the tournament through word of mouth, flyers, local news and television, and even from ads in the Evening Sun and

Mullen himself even traveled to Olean, NY, where the tournament was played in early June and is about three hours away from Norwich. Mullen handed out flyers promoting Norwich and received positive feedback. Aside from Norwich and Olean, Gus Macker also takes place in Ithaca and Jamestown in August.

Mullen also made a televised appearance on WBNG's Around the Tiers, promoting Norwich's tournament as well.


With a new set of participants this year, the Gus Macker committee computed the team results following registration. Gender, age, height, and level of experience was taken into factor.

The Macker organization promotes that everyone can play, but demographics show the game is essentially a youth and family oriented event. 65 percent of participants range from 14 years of age and under while gender aspects reflect around 63 percent of males over 37 females compete in the event.

Based on these results, there are roughly five to a maximum of 17 teams on


Parking



Culinary Explosion: A variety of vendors headlining 2023 Macker

NORWICH-After all eight vendors signed up for Gus Macker in 2022, Mindy Chawgo received 15 vendor forms this year. She collaborated with Tom Revoir, YMCA's Sports Coordinator and Macker Director, on where the vendors would be placed.






