Chenango County Health Department: Vaccines for children?

C H E N A N G O COUNTY – Should I get a COVID-19 Vaccine for my 12-18 Year Old Child?

The answer is yes. CDC recommends everyone 12 years and older should get a COVID-19 vaccination to help protect against COVID-19. Widespread vaccination is a critical tool to help stop the pandemic. Children 12 years and older are able to get the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine at this time.

Although fewer children have been infected with COVID-19 compared to adults, children can:

- Be infected with the virus that causes COVID-19
- Get sick from COVID-19
- Spread COVID-19 to others

It is also important to protect unvaccinated children. Children between the ages of 2

and 12 should wear a mask in public spaces and around others who are not within their household. Going back to school can increase your child's risk of catching or transmitting the coronavirus.

The highly contagious delta variant of the coronavirus is a concern among those who have not been vaccinated, including children. The CDC has updated its recommendations for COVID-19 prevention in K-12 schools and recommends universal indoor masking by all students (age 2 and older), staff, teachers, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status, as well as physical distancing and other precautions.

Having your teen or child vaccinated as soon as he or she is eligible will help prevent infections and continued spread of COVID-

19. It may prevent your child from missing out on activities, sports, school attendance, and other things that they regularly enjoy doing. You are not just protecting your child, but you are helping to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in our community.

To Find a COVID-19 Vaccine for Your Child

Check your local pharmacy's website to see if vaccination walk-ins or appointments are available.

Check with your child's healthcare provider about whether they offer COVID-19 vaccination.

COVID-19 Updates

Chenango County COVID Update

CHENANGO COUNTY – As of Monday there were 83 active cases of COVID-19 in Chenango County, of which 20 were vaccinated, and three individuals are currently hospitalized, one of which is vaccinated.

The Chenango County Department of Health confirmed there have been 4,046 total cases of COVID-19 in Chenango.

There have been 82 confirmed deaths.

The health department also confirmed there are 175 residents under quarantine, and 3,805 total recoveries.

So far approximately 137,097 tests for the virus have been administered in the county.

Greene outscores Unadilla Valley, 44-28

NEW BERLIN - Greene scored two touchdowns on returns, picked up its own fumble and ran for another in 44-28 victory at Unadilla Valley on Saturday afternoon.

Bill Dunlap scored five touchdowns for the Trojans - three on pass receptions, and two on returns - leading the offensive attack.

"We did a lot of good things, but we had way too many penalties," said Greene head coach Dave Gorton. "Some of those mistakes were

because we're young and fatigued, but we hope to clean those up before the next game."

After forcing a UV punt to start the game, Greene drove for a touchdown on its first possession. Quarterback Grayson Flanagan hit Dunlap on a 13-yard TD pass.

Dunlap returned a punt 56 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter, and had his second TD reception from Flanagan to open a 22-0 lead.

UV's Trenton Zvifzdin scored on a TD before halftime paring the deficit to 22-8.

"Defensively we

looked really good for three of the four quarters," said UV coach Art Rigas. "Greene played great defense and special teams. Hat's off to them."

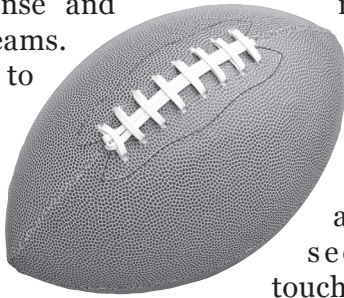
Dunlap scored on another TD reception in the third, and following Unadilla Valley's second touchdown of the game, Dunlap returned the kickoff 79 yards for a score.

Greene's had the lone touchdown in the fourth when Derek

Renfer picked up his own team's fumble, and carried it the final two yards for the final margin.

M a t t Bogdan, K a d e n Butts, and Joey Avolio all scored second-half touchdowns for Unadilla Valley, who play Unatego/Franklin next weekend. Avolio's came on a TD toss from Butts.

"We never quit, but we do have some work to do on special teams," Rigas said.

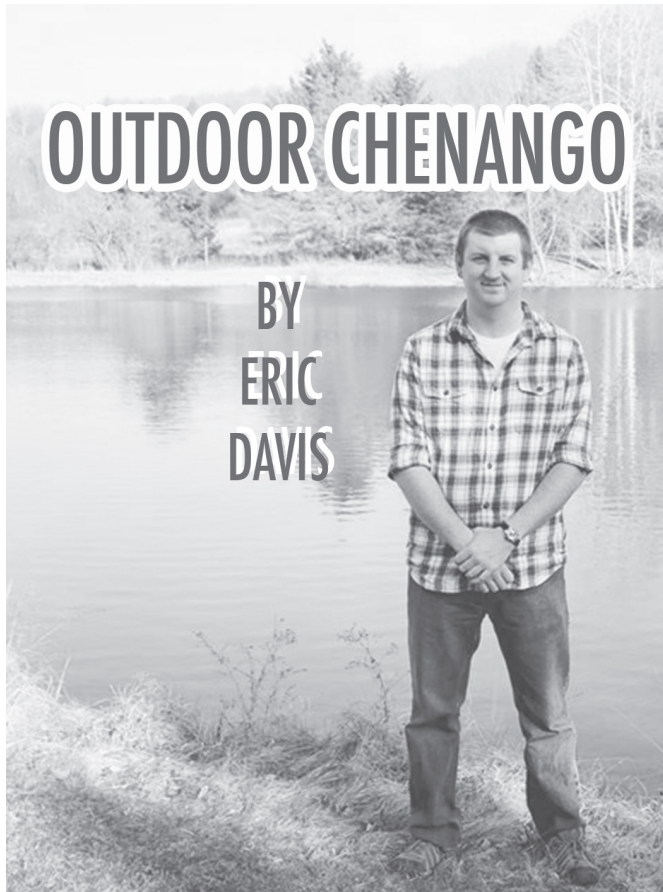

Archery season prep



Archery season is under a month away and for many hunters it is crunch time to get everything ready before opening day.

Whether you have been shooting your bow since last season or haven't thought about it until now,

there are some things that need to happen before October gets here.

The first thing you should do is get your bow out and give it a visual inspection from top to bottom. Look at the limbs looking for cracks or splinters.

You can use a cotton swab (Q-tip) to see if it snags on anything. Next check the string and cables.

The serving at the ends will usually show its wear before the main string section. If you can see the string through gaps in the serving, it should be replaced. To have time for parts to be ordered, shipped, installed, and get it back to able to practice before bow season you would need to get your problem to the shop as soon as possible. Next look over the accessories on your bow, make sure the pins in your sight still are good or make sure your light works if you have a light to illuminate the pins. If your bow passes the inspection, at a minimum give the string and cables a good wax.

With your bow cleared, look at your arrows. Make sure the fletchings are not

damaged, check your nocks, and make sure your inserts aren't loose. You can roll your arrows on a table with the fletching end hanging off to make sure they are straight and not bent. If you use carbon arrows, give them a flex to inspect for cracks or splinters. Check on your broadheads to see if you need to buy any before the season starts.

Practicing with your bow is a must before the season. No matter how little time you might have, a handful of shots is better than none.

If anything, it's more realistic to hunting because you don't get to shoot a bunch to warm up before a deer shows up. Longer practice sessions are good for making sure your distance pins are dialed in and can allow you to try different shot angles or

shooting positions (like from a chair in a blind).

With minimal time before the season, if you've put off any stand moving or lane trimming, it's time to do it or deal with it for the season. The amount of disturbance created by moving a stand can keep deer out of the area for a few days, so if you're going to do it you should do it now.

This can let things calm back down and get back to normal before October. At least check on your stands to make sure they are safely secured to their trees and that they have pull-up ropes and the correct fall-restraint harness accessories.

Get your trail cameras out this weekend if you haven't put them out already. Like in all research, the more data the better. Having cameras out

longer, will give you more data in the form of pictures or videos so you can decide what stands to hunt when the season rolls around. Make sure they have fresh batteries and empty memory cards (or proper plans for mobile cameras) before putting them out.

Every hunter has their own method of treating their clothing to be as scent-free as possible when hunting.

If you want to treat your clothes with permethrin to repel ticks, treat them soon so they can air out for a couple days before washing them (the permethrin lasts multiple washes). A popular device lately is an ozone producer. The extra oxygen molecule in ozone easily breaks free and binds to odor-causing substances.

\$1,164 worth of cigarettes were taken from the Victory warehouse in Norwich. A janitor discovered the robbery Sunday morning and called the police. The cigarettes were kept on the third floor and an elevator used to remove them.

Our ball team blanked Waterville 20-0. Scoring six runs in the first inning was such a shock that the visitors never recovered.

According to the program instructor, Martha Ryan, the workshop helps individuals research and focus on the business plan process. “During the three sessions, we help students explore 100-plus business ideas they can do with little or no investment. Students are inspired to gather the resources they need to start or solidify a business idea,” said Ryan. A grant from the Community Foundation for South Central New York and a scholarship from DCMO BOCES will benefit students. “Female students and graduates from any DCMO BOCES programs qualify for full funding to attend this dinner and workshop series. By removing the financial barriers to attending the program, we hope to impact people’s opportunities to earn money during this time of pandemic restrictions,” said Ryan. Another scholarship is also available for Delaware County residents. The workshop series runs from October 5th through October 28th beginning at 5:30 p.m. with a light dinner until 8 p.m. Students receive

one-on-one assistance to write a business plan. Funding from the Growthwheel organization gives students free access to the business planning tool. “The Growthwheel platform guides students to writing a business plan and expanding at any point. We were so fortunate to receive this resource,” said Ryan. Jennifer Waite, Director of Career & Technical Education at BOCES, commented about the commitment to keeping our graduates in our region by saying, “Our graduates prepare with trade skills and industry credentials to enter the workforce. This program also prepares those who would like to create their own jobs as business owners. We are proud to support our graduates with full funding to attend this program and help them start and grow their businesses right here in our region.”

Students who complete the program will participate in a business plan competition. A \$500 Seed Grant sponsored by Community Bank will be awarded to the best plan. A similar competition, funded by Visions Credit Union was awarded in the past to a BOCES student, James Hill, to start his welding business. According to Ryan, the support from local lending institutions inspires individuals to improve their business planning efforts. The classes will take place at the Pole Campus in Norwich and at the Harrold Campus in Sidney Center. The registration deadline is September 28th. GETTING A LEG IN THE DOOR

The first centipedes appeared about 450 million years ago, making them one of the oldest groups of animals in the world. Scientists have identified more than 3,000 different species of centipede and believe there may be more than twice that number that have yet to be discovered.

Each pair of a centipede's legs are slightly longer than the pair directly in front of it. Centipedes are able to regrow legs lost to a predator.

BIG BUG

Scolopendra gigantea, also known as the Amazonian giant centipede or Peruvian giant centipede, is the largest species of centipede. Some grow to be more than 30 cm (12 in.) in length.

“We had a nice barn and it had all kinds of hay and everything in there, and we used to play hide and go seek,” Gustafson explained. “All of a sudden I thought, boy that’s a dark place, I bet they’ll

never find me. And I got then, landed right in front of a cow. Scared the living soul out of me. And that poor cow,

oh, I felt sorry for it.”

Her siblings were also troublemakers at times, Gustafson said, explaining that two of them once scared their father with a snake.

“They were walking down the road and had a good sized pail. And they were walking, and my dad said, ‘What are you guys doing in the road?’ Well, they said, ‘We’ve got a couple worms in there, Papa,’” said Gustafson. “And then when he got out there, they had a snake in the pail. And my dad almost had a heart failure. He never liked snakes.”

At the age of 16, Gustafson made her way to Norwich to work for a prominent family. She cleaned, cared for their children, and served drinks at their parties.

“I did everything. I cooked. She entertained a lot, she loved cocktail parties, she loved entertaining. And then I cleaned, and I’d cook, I did everything,” she explained.

Gustafson went on

to marry her late husband, Frank Gustafson, who served in the U.S. Navy. They had three children together.

In addition to her large immediate family, Gustafson also has a sprawling extended family, including over a dozen nieces and nephews, as well as several grandchildren and great grandchildren. She said they recently had a family reunion.

“Oh, the reunion. Almost all of my nephews and nieces, all the family came,” she said. “Oh, we had the best time and everybody was so friendly and nice. So we really had a wonderful time.”

Gustafson’s extended family even reaches as far as Sweden.

“I’ve been to Sweden three times. And my mother and sisters, oh, they’ve been six, seven times. Oh they loved it over there,” Gustafson said.

She went on to explain that although she grew up in the United States, she was able to pick up Swedish from hearing

family members, and can still speak Swedish today.

“We had the elderly man, we called him Grandpa, he was so good. And he talked Swedish all the time,” she said. “He said, ‘How in the world, Grace, did you learn Swedish?’ I said, ‘Grandpa, I guess. He talks Swedish all the time and we pick it up and can understand it, and never had no problems.’”

Gustafson said she doesn’t have any big plans for her birthday, but her nieces, Linda and Sandra, hope to pay her a visit.

“I’m just lucky I’ve got Sandra and Linda. And Harley, Sandra’s husband. He’s such a good guy,” said Gustafson. “I’m lucky I got all them. Yeah, that’s wonderful.”

“We all get along so good, we never had no trouble,” she added, speaking to her relationship with her family. “Happy memories, that’s right. They’re all so wonderful.”

Sherburne-Earlville Central School District builds new playground

Donations for the playground amounted to \$18,759. “The grant covered part of it. The PTO also assisted and the building did fundraising to cover the rest of the playground build,” Maistros said.

The COVID-19 pandemic prevented the project from being con-
