Chobani grants \$200,000 to Central New York communities

NEW BERLIN – In its continuing efforts to spark big ideas, Chobani announced this year’s recipients of the annual Chobani Impact Fund – a program designed to fuel innovation, expand economic opportunity, and promote entrepreneurship, diversity and inclusion in Central NY.

Through its partnership with the Community Foundation for South Central New York, \$200,000 in grants will be distributed to five CNY organizations chosen by Chobani’s employee selection committee.

“We know what it’s like for an entrepreneur to have a big dream but need a little financial boost to make it a reality. This is exactly how Chobani was founded,” said Peter McGuinness,

“Our goal is to pay it forward in our home communities by supporting entrepreneurs, development organizations and small businesses, all of whom help to create jobs and

strengthen our local economies.”

Since its debut in 2018, the Chobani Impact Fund has awarded \$1.4M in grants to 30 organizations in Central New York and its other home community in Idaho.

“It’s our pleasure and privilege to partner with Chobani again this year in making these important grants to local organizations meeting critical community needs,” said Diane Brown, Executive Director Community

The 2021 Chobani Community Impact Fund recipients are:
Cornell Cooperative Extension- Chenango County:

The goal of Cornell Cooperative Extension of Chenango County is to help farms keep pace with industry innovations, including transitioning to new farm products and technologies, improving animal health, and better management of natural resources. This Chobani grant will fund the Cornell School of Ag Science Partnership Program – providing farmers in the region with localized recommendations on crop harvests, insect pest

control, and disease issues to help manage crops for greater profit for the farm. (Grant: \$63,000)

Unadilla Community Farm Education Center:
This organization offers space for training, internships, and youth programs on sustainable agriculture, building, and food equity, as well as access to fresh, organic produce for low-income and low-access communities. One of the organization’s programs – the accredited ‘Beginning Farmer Training Program’ – provides agricultural workforce development and training for youth to start their own sustainable food and farm businesses. This grant will create economic opportunity and work-

My experience at the EOH Paranormal Tour

Last Friday, I attended one of the Earlville Opera House Paranormal Tours with my husband Dustin. We chose the 10 p.m. to midnight time slot, and when it finally rolled around I was chomping at the bit to get ghost hunting!

The EOH Executive Director Michelle Connelly had told me

all about the alleged hauntings within the building just two weeks prior, and her stories swirled in my mind as we pulled up to the looming structure. The 20 or so people in attendance gathered in a room just outside the theater, and seasoned paranormal investigator Kenny Harris explained the different types of ghost hunting equipment he had brought along that evening.

His arsenal included electromagnetic frequency (EMF) detectors, a spirit box, motion detectors, and more. He also told us where he and his crew had set up cameras and motion detectors in the theater, and explained

that in the past they’ve witnessed more spiritual activity when a musical act was performing

on the stage.

During our investigation, we would get to hear the musical styl-

ings of Reyna Stagnaro, a local singer-songwriter. And with any luck, it would stir up the spirits

of past musicians and illicit messages from them.

We went into the theater and settled into the audience, rife with anticipation. Reyna took the stage and played a couple songs for us, and afterwards Dustin told me he swore it sounded like someone was sitting next to him harmonizing with her!

Throughout Reyna’s performance, a “cat ball,” which is essentially a light-up motion detector resembling a cat toy, that was set up on the back staircase was going crazy. Harris and his team took notice, and began asking questions to see

if they were truly interacting with a spirit.

And amazingly, when they asked the spirit to turn on the light, it would turn on! Then, when they asked it to turn it off, the light would go off.


Next, they fired up the spirit box, which rapidly sweeps through radio stations creating white noise. It is believed that spirits can use the energy emitted by the spirit box and the white noise to speak to us. Unfortunately, we didn't receive any messages for some time.

Something spooky did happen to me, though. At one point early on in the investigation, the cat ball lit up and of course we all turned to look at it. A little to the right of the staircase, I swear I saw a tall, human-shaped figure glide across the floor and disappear. It had no discernible features, and looked almost like a three-dimensional shadow. A ghost? I hope so!

We heard a few more songs from Reyna, and then the group split to investigate the green room, a small alcove off of stage left. The investigators set up the spirit box in there, and we took turns filtering in and out, hoping to catch a word or two.

At this point in the night, I decided to fire up a few tools of my own. I'm not ashamed to admit I have my own small arsenal of ghost hunting equipment on my cell phone!

I started out with my SLS camera, which can detect human-like figures in an area, and displays them as jointed stick figures on the screen. While it did detect the shapes of the fellow living people in the room, I didn't catch

any unexplained figures.

Next, I pulled out what the app calls an EVP recorder, but is actually more akin to an Ovilus. An Ovilus is a device that utilizes a word bank, and supposedly spirits can speak into it, and the word box will detect these words and display them on the screen.

Now, I'm not sure how much I really believe in this one. The way my phone app works, the spirits are supposed to spell out what they're trying to say, and when enough letters are detected it will display the completed word. Seems like a lot of work

for such a short message!

Nevertheless, I got it up and running and kept it going for most of the night. While I didn't get anything definitive, I will say I received more messages in that hour than I have in the weeks I've been using it.

In my opinion, the most convincing message I received through the Ovilus was during a period in which there was no music being played, and the spirit box was in the other room. Investigators and EOH Executive Director Michelle Connelly were simply speaking to the spirits, and welcoming

them to communicate with us.

At one point, Connelly asked if there were any ghosts in the room that were connected to a member of the audience. Immediately, my screen displayed the name "Julianne." So, if there was anyone named Julianne at the Earlville Opera House with us that evening, someone was trying to talk to you!

A few other messages came through that were, maybe, slightly compelling. Towards the end of the night, one of the investigators made a comment about the cat ball being the most effective tool that evening. When they asked if the spirit enjoyed the device, my phone displayed the word "keep." I guess they really did like it, and wanted to keep it for themselves!

It is also worth mentioning that I had been using this device for several weeks before using it at the EOH, but that night was the first time I have ever seen misspelled words displayed. This could absolutely be an issue with the app, but it made me wonder if perhaps the spirit communicating just wasn't the best at spelling.

For example, Connelly told us about Daniel, a drummer who performed at the EOH in the 1940s, and who often shows up as a blue orb in videos, hovering above the drummer of whatever band is performing.

She explained that Daniel had told them during a prior investigation that he passed around the time of WWII. It is unclear, however, if his death was actually a result of the war.

But, as she was talking about him, I got the word "solder." Of course, solder is an actual word, but could it be possible Daniel misspelled it and actually meant "soldier"?

One last interesting message: the words "touched" and "body" were displayed one immediately after the other. It is also pertinent to note that Dustin, normally able to regulate his body temperature like a normal person, was absolutely freezing for most of the night. Sure, it was chilly in there. But I'm usually the one with chattering teeth in 70 degree weather, and I was perfectly comfortable!

Is it possible there was

the spirit of a singer sitting next to him through the night, harmonizing with the performer and touching Dustin, making him cold? I'll let you decide for yourself!

The final impressive piece of evidence from the night was in the green room. Dustin and I finally made our way in and listened to the spirit box for a while, without hearing much. But, when Harris came in to retrieve it and bring it on stage, being sure to tell the spirit it was their turn, a voice came through saying, "Let's go!"

While we didn't receive any definitive evidence during our investigation, there were still several things we experienced at the Earlville Opera House that could have been caused by lingering spirits. Overall, Dustin and I had a fun evening, and it's pretty cool to know we were a part of an actual ghost hunt with a team of paranormal investigators!

I hope the EOH brings their Paranormal Tours back next October, because I would love to return and see what other messages we receive from beyond the veil.



UHS Chenango Memorial announces Moderna booster clinics

NORWICH – UHS Chenango Memorial Hospital will be hosting two upcoming vaccination clinics for eligible individuals looking to receive a booster or third dose of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine. The clinics will be held from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. on both Saturday, November 6 and Saturday, November 13 in UHS Cardiology Norwich, located on the hospital’s first floor.

“Now that the Moderna vaccine has received emergency use authorization for booster shots, we’re encouraging everyone eligible to receive one to schedule an appointment,” said David Finney, Vice President of Clinical

Services at the Norwich hospital.

Appointments can be made by calling the UHS Chenango Memorial Vaccine Line at (607) 337-4888 or by contacting their medical provider’s office.

According to Finney, the Moderna booster is not just for individuals who previously received the Moderna

“While it’s generally recommended that you receive the same vaccine you were initially administered, individuals do have more flexibility of choice when it comes to receiving a booster,” he explained.

Eligibility criteria for receiving a booster varies based on the original vaccine received.

“If you initially received the Moderna

or Pfizer vaccine, your eligibility to receive a booster is based on the time elapsed since you received your second dose of that vaccine in addition to certain other criteria,” Finney said.

Right now, that’s defined as someone who completed their second dose at least 6 months ago and is either (a) over the age of 65 – or – (b) 18 and older with certain underlying medical conditions, living or working in a long-term or congregate care setting, or who are at increased risk of exposure to COVID-19 based on their work environment, such as healthcare workers.

Anyone who has received Johnson & Johnson’s single-dose Janssen vaccine may receive a booster provided two months have passed since they were administered the vaccine.

According to Finney, UHS Chenango Memorial’s Vaccination Team will be using the Cardiology suite on the hospital’s first floor for the two Moderna booster clinics.

“We used this space for our largest community clinics early in our vaccination efforts, and know we can very comfortably accommodate our schedule in this space,” he said.

Anyone interested in scheduling an appointment to receive the vaccine, can do so by calling the CMH COVID Vaccine Line at (607) 337-4888 or by contacting their UHS medical provider’s office.

NBT Bancorp announces third quarter net income of \$37.4 million

NORWICH – On Tuesday NBT Bancorp Inc. (“NBT” or the “Company”) (NASDAQ: NBTB) reported net income and diluted earnings per share for the three and nine months ended September 30, 2021.

Net income for the three months ended September 30, 2021 was \$37.4 million, or

\$0.86 per diluted common share.

Net income increased \$2.3 million from the third quarter of 2020, primarily due to changes in the estimated impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on expected credit losses.

The third quarter 2020 provision for loan losses was \$3.3 million compared to the third

quarter 2021 provision release of \$3.3 million.

Net income decreased \$2.9 million from the previous quarter primarily due to a lower net benefit from provision for loan losses and slightly higher non-interest expense, partly offset by higher noninterest income.

Pre-provision net revenue (“PPNR”)1 for

the third quarter of 2021 was \$47.4 million compared to \$49.0 million in the previous quarter and \$49.6 million in the third quarter of 2020. Income from Paycheck Protection Program (“PPP”) loans decreased \$1.9 million and \$1.8 million from the previous quarter and the third quarter of 2020, respectively.

NBT President and CEO John H. Watt Jr. commented, “We continue to experience momentum across the markets we serve. Our team is focused on our customers and successful execution of our key strategies.

“Across our New England footprint, we are advancing our growth strategy by

leveraging the market disruption occurring in that region. Our balance sheet is strong and it continues to provide us optionality to deploy capital in a strategic manner, and we are actively exploring opportunities.”

Make the most of all the water

It appears that the rain doesn't want to stop for more than a couple days this year. It pauses only long enough to give you a

false sense of security that things are going to dry out. Before you decide to build an ark, here are some ways to take advantage of the high waters.

Duck season is open and puddle ducks, such as mallards, feed primarily on seeds in wetlands. The freshly flooded fields in many places provide a smorgasbord of food not usually available during lower waters.

It may take a day or two of scouting to find where they are going but it is worth it once you find them. Also, since the area usually is dry, the bottom will be solid compared to the soft muck usually found in swampy areas.

In the aftermath of the hurricanes in 2011, one of my housemates and I hunted a flooded brush lot that was between two swamps that were the normal duck hangouts in the area.

We had no problems walking out and setting up our decoys in the waist-high waters in our chest waders. It did not take very long for us to have our limit of ducks with a surprising mix of teal and mallards. Goose season also reopened last weekend for most of the reading area of this newspaper. Flooded corn fields can be great places for a combination duck and goose hunt. Just make sure you know what area you are hunting as the limit was dropped

to 1 goose per person in a large portion of the state while it remains at 5 geese per person in other areas.

If waterfowl is not your thing, the deer activity should be ramping up as the first does are coming into heat any day. The question is: what happens to deer when it floods? The short answer is almost nothing changes. They have to keep eating to get ready for winter and they have to have bedding areas to stay away from predators.

The major change is if their bedding area gets flooded, then deer with leave the area. Extended flooding in feeding areas can also push deer out of an area as the deer must then all compete for a reduced food source.

Research in the South has shown that adult bucks almost always return to their home range once the high water recedes, so you may have to wait it out if the area you hunt is flooded. If you have high ground to hunt, you could see an uptick in deer from those displaced in lower elevations. Be prepared to call to bucks as they can be very receptive to calling in this phase of

the rut.

The highly saturated ground and wet leaves can allow you to stealthily make your way through the woods or in fields. Standing cornfields provide deer with cover and food, making it so they don't leave the cornfield. Still hunting row by row can allow you to spot a bedded deer and then stalk up a nearby row to get within bow range. Make sure to stalk into the wind so the deer don't smell you before you get to them.

If you are waiting for crossbow or firearm season, this weekend would be a good time to check on stands or ground blinds since you can move around with more stealth. Even if you do bump deer, there is time for things to calm down before you'll be back in the woods.

If you have the opportunity, use a covered shooting area to sight in your crossbow or firearm so that it is ready for opening day. You could also use the weekend to wash your gear and make sure you have everything you need. That way if you find something is missing you have time to replace it before you need it.



Food, water and climate tour with local legislators and senators

OTSEGO COUNTY – On October 4 and 5, The Otsego County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Committee and Cornell Cooperative Extension Schoharie and Otsego Counties came together to host the Food, Water, and Climate Farm Tour.

State legislators spent two days meeting farmers in our area to hear their commitment to farming and the challenges confronting them day to day and generation to generation. "The common interests we all share is the need for clean water and a secure food supply, and a desire to work together

in combating climate change" stated Jim Barber, Ag & Farmland Implementation Specialist, from CCE Schoharie and Otsego Counties who coordinated the event.

The tour brought all those interests together by showcasing the diversity of agriculture in the New York City and Upper Susquehanna watersheds, and the role our farms play in fulfilling those interests. Stops on the tour included: Lucky Dog Organic Farm (Hamden), Chicory Creek Farm (Mt. Vision), Brick House Road Farm (Richfield Springs), and Middlefield Orchard

(Middlefield), as well as The 607 CSA Food Hub and Cooperstown Distillery.

Participants heard from the NYC Watershed Agricultural Council about the work they do with farmers to protect water quality in the largest unfiltered municipal watershed in the world. Well-managed farmland is a preferred land use in the watershed, building healthy soils which aid in carbon sequestration and do the work of providing food and filtering rainwater runoff.

The diversity of agriculture in our region was also on display during the tour, including farmers of all ages

on farms both organic and conventional, producing hundreds of varieties of fruits and vegetables, and pasture-raised beef. The Legislators heard repeatedly that, while farming is hard work, the biggest challenge for many farms is marketing what they produce. The legislators were also reminded of the important role that farmers, and organizations such as The 607 CSA, play in providing access to food in underserved and economically challenged communities throughout the state.

The Food, Water, & Climate Farm Tour was successful in mak-

ing some of those connections and initiating important dialogue with Legislators from around the state. Everyone came away with a sincere appreciation for the commitment and hard work of our farmers in building a healthier future for our communities, our economies, and our environment.

The Food, Water, and Climate Farm Tour couldn't have been made possible without the commitment of the Otsego County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Committee, Cornell Cooperative Extension Schoharie and Otsego Counties, and finan-

cial support from Farm Credit East, and Otsego County.





SPCA installs Little Free Libraries

NORWICH — The Chenango SPCA recently installed Little Free Libraries at their facility on County Road 32 in Norwich. The units are located under the trees next to the sidewalk leading in to the SPCA facility, and guests are welcome to take and leave books of their choosing.

“Little Free Libraries is a nation-wide thing where people can put up these small libraries. They probably hold, you know, 18 books or so, and people can come and take a book or they can leave a book, and we will restock this periodically,” said Chenango SPCA Executive Director Annette Clarke. “We have an adult one and one for children. When I say adult, it’s adults and teens. You know, it’s just typical novels, but there’s also some novels with animals in it.”

The libraries were made possible by grant funding through the Otis Thompson Foundation, according to Clarke.

“It was a grant, and I wrote it for the Little Libraries, and we sent them pictures, and what we would do with it, and then where we’d put it. And so, yeah, they were very good about it,” said Clarke. “They donated money for both the unit, the actual little library

units, as well as some money towards books.”

Clarke added that she chose Little Free Libraries because they could be done in coordination with the SPCA’s Book Buddies program, where children can come to the shelter and read books to the animals.

“Especially with children, they may feel hesitant and a little intimidated by reading to an

adult. But reading to an animal is very relaxing, because the animal is non-judgmental and won’t worry if they stumble over a word,” Clarke explained. “What they have found nationally is, students who do this, who have trouble reading but come and read to animals, that their reading improves tremendously.”

The Book Buddies

program has been a part of the Chenango SPCA for several years. Clarke said the shelter provides books of many reading levels for children, but said adults are also welcome to stop in with their own book to read to the animals as well.

“Usually we have books in the room of different levels. Or, we encourage adults to come, bring their own

book and come sit in the cat room, let the cats crawl on them and sit with them while they read,” said Clarke. “It’s kind of a win-win for both the cats and for the people.”

Currently, those wishing to participate in the Book Buddies program must contact the Chenango SPCA to make an appointment.

As of October 26, the Chenango SPCA is home to 179 cats and 12 dogs, putting them over capacity.

“We adopt them out, and then we get more in. So, I think so far, I know we’ve adopted out over 31 animals for the month of October so far. But we’re still, you know, we have a total of 191 at the shelter,” Clarke explained. “We have, comfortably, room for about 110.”

To help with the cost of caring for the animals, Clarke said the SPCA is participating in the Save a Life Campaign through Staffworks, which aims to raise money for non-profits relating to animals and their care.

Community members can donate to the SPCA through November 30 and December 31, and the Save a Life Campaign will match up to \$10,000, according to Clarke.

“Coming up, our Save a Life Foundation through Staffworks is doing, again, the up to \$10,000 match on our appeal, and that’s starting November 30,”

she said. “Last year we raised 92,000 [dollars], and we got a match of 26 [thousand dollars]. So we’re hoping to do better this year. Even better, you know, to see if we can beat our record.”

The Chenango SPCA also recently participated in the Tractor Supply Rescue Your Rescue event, and is currently participating in the Subaru Love Your Pet Program, which ends on Sunday, October 31.

“We thank Subaru, Bill Rapp Subaru, for coordinating with us on the Subaru Challenge, and Tractor Supply for working with us,” said Clarke. “We’re waiting to hear, we did a Tractor Supply [contest] where people had to vote for us. And we put it out there and we hope that enough people voted.”

According to the Chenango SPCA, they are a no-kill animal shelter serving the Chenango County area and surrounding communities.

“Chenango SPCA (CSPCA) is a no-kill animal shelter that provides care for lost and homeless pets, adopts pets to new homes, and educates families and the community about the needs of companion animals ... The mission of the Chenango SPCA is to provide and promote care, compassion, and respect for our animals and our community.”

LOST IN SPACE

Objects in the Oort cloud are separated from each other by millions of kilometers.

The inner cloud of the Oort cloud is often called the "Hills" cloud in honor of Jack G. Hills, who theorized its existence in 1981.

What do you get when you cross the Oort cloud with a movie director? Oortsen Welles.

What do you call the funniest members of the Oort cloud? Cometians.

Why was it difficult for the Oort cloud object to make friends? He was cold.

NASA's Voyager 1 spacecraft is leaving our solar system at a rate of about 1.6 million km (1 million mi.) per day. Even at that speed, it will not reach the inner Oort cloud for another 300 years, and it will take another 30,000 years to reach the outer edge.

The Oort cloud consists of two parts: the thick outer shell, which is spherical, and the inner cloud, which is shaped more like a doughnut. The outer edge of the Oort cloud defines the cosmic boundary of our solar system.

Our current scientific instruments are not capable of observing the Oort cloud directly.

The Oort cloud is almost unimaginably huge. The inner cloud begins at about 300 billion km (186 billion mi.) from the sun, and the outer shell may reach as far as 1.5 trillion km (930 billion mi.). The outer edge is so far away that it may reach as far as halfway to the nearest star, Proxima Centauri, which is 4.22 light-years away.

IN OUR GALAXY, BUT FAR, FAR AWAY

The comets on the outer edge of the Oort cloud are so far from the sun that their orbits are easily altered by the gravitational pull of passing stars, and the Milky Way galaxy itself.

Light from our sun takes nearly a year and a half to reach the outer edge of the Oort cloud.

MAKE A LONG STORY SHORT

There are two basic types of comets in our solar system. A "short-period" comet is one that completes its orbit around the sun in less than 200 years. A "long-period" comet takes longer than 200 years to return. Long-period comets are believed to originate in the Oort cloud.
