NORWICH – The winner of a billboard art competition co-sponsored by Colorscape Chenango Arts Festival and Golden Artist Colors, Inc. has been chosen. This billboard will be displayed later this summer along Route 12 just north of Norwich.

Madison Parker, of Unadilla Valley High School, created the image to fit the theme, “Keep it Kind.” Her work was chosen from among 54 submissions from Chenango County high school students.

“I was inspired by a magical theme to promote kindness because being kind can sometimes spread in a magical way. I am honored to be able to have my artwork up on the billboard and I hope kindness can make people

feel magical. Thank you for this honor!”

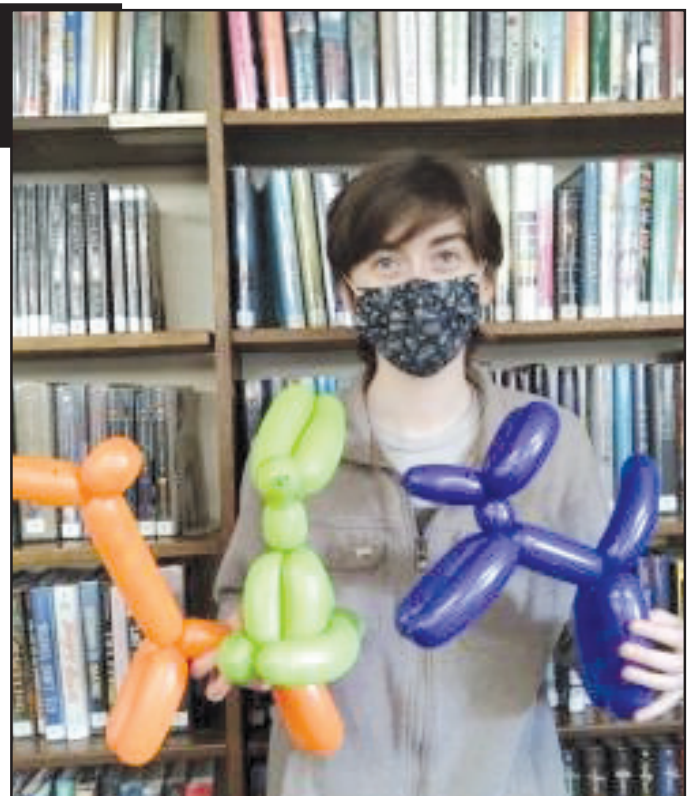

Dads and grads gifts

June is a month that can mean a lot of gift-giving, between Father's Day and high school graduation. When it comes to giving gifts, it can be tricky to know what to get for outdoor recreationalists.

Especially for those that seem to have everything or possibly for those who are starting out and don't have anything.

A well-seasoned angler or hunter can have virtually everything there is to have, making shopping difficult. An easy solution is to get a gift card to a store they shop at that way they can use it to get exactly what they want. Another good gift is to focus on “consumables” that get used and need to be replaced. If they process their own game or fish, vacuum

sealer bags or a knife sharpener make sense.

Single use hand warmers may seem silly now, if you can even find them this time of year, but it would be one less thing to have to buy this fall. New spools of fishing line, packages of sinkers, and hooks should make most anglers happy. If you have a reloader to buy for, knowing what components they use would allow you to buy exactly what they use. Otherwise, I would stick to a gift card, so you don't buy the wrong powder or projectiles.

With the weather breaking for summer, boating becomes very popular either with a motorboat or in kayaks. Kayaks come in two styles, sit-in and sit-on. Sit-in kayaks are more stable because your body is lower inside of

the hull compared to being on the top for sit-on kayaks.

Sit-on kayaks keep all your body and legs on the top of the kayak so

there is no change of tipping over and being “trapped” in the hull. Most sit-in kayak have a large opening so you can easily get out if you

do capsize. If you buy a kayak, you will also need a paddle and personal flotation device (PFD). Make sure you get a Type III PFD, which is designed to allow you to be active while wearing it.

While it might be tapering off some as birds are nesting, bird-watching is an easy outdoors activity to get into for a low price. A decent pair of binoculars can be bought for around \$100 these days. Add on a field guide to help you identify the birds for another \$20.

Keeping track of your Life List of birds with a family member or significant other can be a great way to have something you do together. Once you have recorded most of the birds around here, you can plan trips to other parts of the state or even the

country to try to check
off the harder to find
birds.

Hiking can also be a fun summertime activity. A good foundation of gear for a hiker includes lightweight polyester clothing, waterproof footwear, and a decent backpack. A couple bottles of water and some snacks carried in the backpack can be crucial on some hikes.

A map and compass for navigating are the bare minimum. A handheld GPS or even a smartphone with the right app downloaded can help new hikers find where they are going. The Finger Lakes Trail has numerous sections nearby so it would not require long distance travel to give hiking a try.

AYRSHIRE

A breed of dairy cattle that originated from the County of Ayr in Scotland. The average mature Ayrshire cow weighs 1,000-1,300 pounds and has red markings that can vary in color from orange to brown.



BROWN SWISS

Originated on the Swiss Alps. Known for producing the second largest quantity of milk annually of any dairy breed, their milk averages 4 percent butterfat and 3.4 percent protein which makes it ideal for cheese production. Brown Swiss are gray-brown in color and are known for their immense size, large ears and docile temperament.



GUERNSEY

A small, cream-and-brown breed of dairy cattle that produces more milk per unit of body weight than any other breed. Guernseys are renowned for the high butterfat content of their milk. Bred on the British Channel Island of Guernsey and descended from cattle stock brought from nearby Normandy.

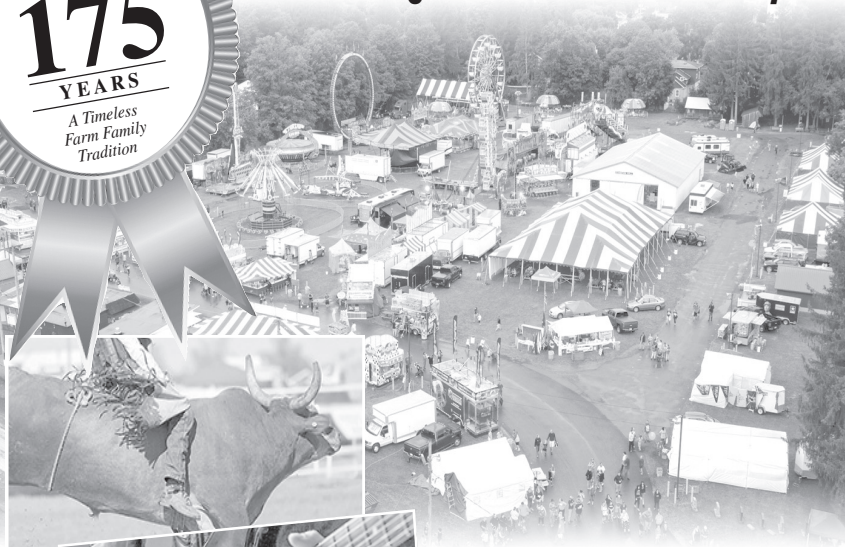


HOLSTEIN

FAQ - About Cows
How much milk does a cow give each day?
On average, a cow will produce 6-7 gallons of milk each day.

What do cows eat?
Cows eat about 100 pounds of feed each day, which is a combination of hay, grain and silage (fermented corn or grass). They drink a lot of water too – up to 50 gallons a day.

How many stomachs do cows have?
A cow has one stomach with four different chambers, which is why many people say that a cow has four stomachs.

How many breeds of dairy cattle are there?
There are six main breeds of dairy cows: Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein, Jersey and Milking Shorthorn.

What do you call male and female dairy animals?
Males are called bulls. Females, prior to giving birth, are called calves or heifers. Once they give birth, female dairy animals are called cows. All cows give milk once they have a calf.

YMCA Camp Thompson registration is open for the season

NORWICH — The Norwich Family YMCA Camp Thompson is open for the summer season, with day camp programs officially beginning on June 27 for children in kindergarten through eighth grade.

“Kindergarten through fifth grade is the Y Camp Thompson program, and then sixth through eighth grade is called Junior Leaders at Camp Thompson,” said YMCA Youth Development Director Kelly Reppert. “So that program gives the children a little bit more independence, a little bit more responsibility. But they still get to enjoy all of the fun things of camp, and they still have a camp counselor with them throughout the day, and all of those things are still the same.”

Registration is ongoing throughout the summer months, and parents can sign their

kids up for whatever days they need childcare.

“Families can do whatever works best for them or whatever they need,” said Reppert. “Some families will register for the whole summer, some will be just for a day, or some for a week. So it’s very flexible for whatever is needed.”

Sign up forms and a parent’s handbook are available online at norwichymca.org, or physical copies can be picked up at the Norwich Family YMCA

front desk.

Camp programs cost \$25 per day for YMCA members and \$35 per day for non-members, but financial assistance is available for those who need it through the YMCA Open Doors Scholarship program.

“We started the campaign several years ago in an attempt to raise additional funds to support scholarships that we were giving out to individuals and families that would like to use the YMCA but might be in a tough financial pinch,”

explained YMCA Executive Director and CEO Jamey Mullen. “It could be based upon their annual income, it could be because of financial challenges with relocating, financial challenges due to bankruptcy, financial challenges due to medical or attending doctors appointments, and things of that nature.”

“The financial assistance can be good for membership to provide access to the facility, but it’s also good for program fees also,” he continued. “A lot of families need childcare, so they will apply for some assistance to help them with the ongoing cost of childcare for their children, so they can continue to work and know their children will be in a safe spot during non-school hours or after school hours.”

Scholarship applications are available on the Norwich Family YMCA website

and at the front desk. Applicants will need to submit a completed application as well as a copy of the prior year’s tax return 1040 form, and other supplemental documents. Processing of applications can take up to two weeks.

The awarding of a scholarship can help to cover the cost of a child attending Camp Thompson, where they can enjoy several outdoor activities, games, and crafts.

“There’s different outdoor activities. They can swim in the lake that’s there, they have yard games, they go on nature walks, there’s a gaga pit game, that’s one of the children’s favorites. So different things like that. There’ll be arts and crafts,” said Reppert. “The activities will be differentiated by age. So the activities for the younger kids will be age appropriate for them, where they might have different expectations for the older children. So they stay within their age group throughout the day and they go through rotations with their age group, and each group has a dedicated counselor for the day.”

The YMCA day camp program runs for eight weeks in total, ending on August 19. In addition to the many activities available at Camp Thompson, each week will also have its own theme.

“Each week will have its own theme. I don’t know all of the specific themes at this time. I know some favorites that have been done in the past are Water Palooza, Olympics Week, I believe that was called Camp Olympics, and Summer Beach Party,” said Reppert.

Children who are registered for camp can be dropped off at the Norwich Family YMCA as early as 7 a.m., but no later than 8:45 a.m. Buses will transport the kids to Camp Thompson, located at 330 George Crumb Road in Smyrna, at 9 a.m. for a full day of summer fun. They will be brought back to the YMCA at 4 p.m., and parent pickup will be held between 4:30 and 5:30 p.m.


In the event of inclement weather, children will stay at the Norwich Family YMCA for the day, where Reppert said “the groups go to the kids’ gym, the main gym, and the swimming pool.”

Following the middle school boys’ races, The Growlers’ eight high school racers were ready to race. The first up was the JV boys’ race. The Growlers had five riders in this race. All five finished the four-lap race. Norwich

junior Drew Brooks took the win, marking his third race win in a row.

The next JV rider was Downsville senior Steven Brown coming in 14th followed by Norwich Junior Grayson Boyer in 18th. Norwich’s two seniors, twin brothers, Andrew and Dan Thompson took 23rd and 24th respectively.

The next race featured the sophomore boys, where Unadilla Valley’s Charlie Sheldon finished in 22nd place in his three-lap race. The final race of the day was the three-lap freshman boys’ race, where the Growlers had Unadilla Valley’s Alex Kemnah racing to a ninth place finish followed by Norwich’s Braedon Baker in 10th.

The Growlers placed

eighth as a team to close out the day. The team used the Boy-Girl-Boy scoring combination with a total of 2,078 points.

Once the racing was complete, NICA NY overall season stats were compiled. The team ended the season in seventh place with 9,530 points overall. This is the team’s best finish since joining NICA.

Drew Brooks was the lone Growlers’ season podium winner. He finished first overall in the JV boys’ category. It was a nail-biter down to the last race, where the best scores of four of five races are used for overall points and if a rider raced in all five races, a bonus of 25 points is added to their season ending points total.

Drew missed one race, so all year long he was battling no points scored and knowing he couldn’t drop any of the other races with either getting sick or a DNF. Drew beat out Pleasantville’s Ewen MacDonald (who finished in fourth on the day with 569 points scored) by six points for the overall season championship when the scoring was settled. Drew was also named the Evening Sun / Pennysaver racer of the

day for his overall performance.

The Skylla Engineering racer of the day was senior Steven Brooks for his 14th place finish in the four-lap JV boys’ race.

The Prime General Contracting racer of the day was Alex Dennis for his two-lap effort in the eighth grade boys’ race.

The Preferred Mutual racer of the day was Amon Oliver for his 12th place finish in the seventh grade boys’ race.

The R.E. Brooks Construction racer of the day was Madison Lawrence for her 12th place finish in the JV girls’ race.

The RSD Motorsports racer of the day was Emma Brooks for her ninth place in the JV girls’ race.

The Action Cyclery LLC racer of the day was Alex Kemnah for his ninth place finish in the freshman boys’ race.
