

Lynne Walton ordained as a deacon

NORWICH — Emmanuel Episcopal Church Mission Outreach Coordinator Lynne Walton was ordained to the Sacred Order of Deacons on the Feast of St. Barnabas, Saturday, June 11 by the Bishop of Central New York Rt. Rev. Dr. DeDe Duncan-Probe. Her ordination marks the seventh ordination in the church's 190year history, and the first to be held at Emmanuel Episcopal in 31 years.

Walton grew up attending St. Andrew's Church in her hometown of New Berlin, and earned her Bachelor's Degree in Microbiology from Cornell University. She worked as a Health, Safety, and Environmental Manager for Proctor and Gamble for 32 years, the final 15 of which were spent in Cincinnati, Ohio.

After retiring, Walton moved back to her home of Chenango County with her

family, and began searching for ways to be more involved in the Episcopal church. In just two weeks after retiring, Walton was enrolled in divinity school and training to become a vocational deacon.

"Every bishop has been ordained a deacon first. Every priest has been ordained a deacon first," Walton explained. "They still should all be able to do a deacon's job, so to speak. Work their way up from the bottom."

"What I'm looking to be is what they call a vocational deacon, or permanent deacon. I don't want to be a preacher, I don't want to be a priest," she continued. "Deacons are called to be ministers of the faith just like anyone else, but then you're ordained to clergy. You're also called to take on the authority of being responsible for outreach, for taking care of the people that Jesus told us to take care of, told his apostles to take care of."

Caring for others is a passion of Walton's. She has worked at the Emmanuel Church Episcopal Norwich as a Mission Outreach Coordinator for ten years to help community members with limited utility grants, and with connecting them to other resourc-

such es as Salvation the Army, Catholic Charities, and government organizations.

Blues powerhouse Carolyn Wonderland at EOH on June 25

EARLVILLE - A pet, accordion, piano, Doug Sahm. musical force equipped with the soulful vocals of Janis and the guitar slinging skills of Stevie Ray, Carolyn Wonderland reaches into the depths of the Texas blues tradition with the wit of a poet. She hits the stage with unmatched presence, a true legend in her time. Earlville Opera House is thrilled to present Carolyn on Saturday, June 25, 7pm, returning to our historic Main Stage by popular demand for our 50thanniversary.

Carolyn Wonderland grew up the child of a singer in a band and began playing her mother's vintage Martin guitar when other girls were dressing dolls. She'd gone from being the teenage toast of her hometown Houston to sleeping in her van in Austin amid heaps of critical acclaim for fine recordings. Along with the guitar and the multitude of other instruments she learned to play – trummandolin, lap steel – Wonderland's ability to whistle remains most unusual. Whistling is a uniquely vocal art seldom invoked in modern music, yet it's among the most spectacular talents the human voice possesses.

That vocal proficiency was well-established in the singer's midteens, landing her gigs at Fitzgerald's by age 15.

She absorbed Houston influences like Little Screamin' Kenny, Albert Collins, Lavelle White, Jerry Lightfoot, Joe "Guitar" Hughes, Little Joe Washington, and "borrowed" a car to sneak out and jam, ending up swapping songs with Townes Van Zandt at Houston's Local's on White Oak, got involved in the underground theater scene becoming the first "Photochick" in Jason Nodler's "In the Under Thunderloo", and soaked up touring bands like the Paladins, Los Lobos, and the Mad Hatter of Texas music,

Carolyn's music played in television series such as "Time of Your Life" and NBC's "Homicide." The Lone Star State was as credible a proving ground for blues in the 1980s and 90s as existed, especially in Austin with Stevie Ray Vaughan & Double Trouble, the Fabulous Thunderbirds, Angela Strehli, Omar & the Howlers, and Lou Ann Barton all in their prime. By the following decade, Austin's blues luster thinned, but Houston, always a bastion of soul and R&B, boasted the Imperial Monkeys with effervescent Carolyn Wonderland as ruler of the jungle. Her angelic voice can turn into "a Class 5 hurricane all within the drop of a hat".



New drivers can learn about car basics at educational session this month

NORWICH – The City of Norwich Youth Bureau, the Northeast Classic Car Museum, and the area's autodealerships mobile will team up later this month to help newer drivers learn important car basics. This session will be held at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, June 28 at the Northeast Classic Car Museum.

City Norwich of Youth Bureau Director Anthony Testani explained the joint ven-

the agencies, and as that person I have been working here over the years trying to get more knowledgeable about what the other agencies do, and to help when someone calls here if I can't do something for them, get them to the right person."

In addition to her outreach work, Walton works also with Emmanuel Episcopal on their weekly free hot dog lunches, which began as a way to provide more meal options to those who need it as well as bring the community together.

"Our church does the hot meal during the winter, one hot meal a month, and during the summer we started the hot dogs one day a week, on Wednesdays," she said, adding that while it took time to build up the hot dog lunches, they have grown into a positive community gathering. "It's the kind of thing we love to do, and again, it's just for not preaching to anybody, it's just a matter of being more community minded and trying to have people feel comfortable."

The Episcopal faith places a large emphasis on inclusivity and open-mindedness, something that Walton said is one of her favorite parts of the church.

"The Episcopal faith, it really is on tradition, scripture, and reason. And Episcopalians are probably as open-minded on a lot of things, because we base everything on the fact that if it's done with love, you're doing the right thing," said Walton. "We love LGBTQ, we love diversity, we love everybody being receptive and open and caring, we love being just, and we love taking care of people. We don't love meanness. we don't love judgmental people, we don't love oppression. So it's kind of like, what is there not to like exactly?"

> "[They] will present me to the bishop saying that they deem I have met all the criteria and that I am an upstanding person, I'm okay to be a deacon in the church," Walton explained. "I have to do vows, and it's kind of like wedding vows, where I vow to obey the bishop, I vow that I believe in Jesus, of course, and I vow that I'm going to learn more about the Bible and the scriptures and follow God, the Ten Commandments, and obey all the things that God and the church are telling me to do, and or that I'm going to live a righteous life and try to make my family live a righteous life."

Now that she is offi-

cially ordained as a deacon, Walton said her role will be to serve the Bishop of the Central New York Diocese DeDe Duncan-Probe.

"You serve as a waiter for the bishop, you basically set the table for communion and do anything the bishop wants. In fact, as a deacon that's the one thing people don't realize, as a deacon once you're ordained you don't work for a priest at all, you only work for the bishop of the diocese," she said.

"The bishop will ask the deacons, like if she has to go do a special event somewhere for ordaining another priest, or for blessing a church, or for some particular event, she may call on the deacons to come and assist at that event. Whether the deacons are in Watertown or Syracuse

her diocese, we should be willing to go and serve with the bishop wherever she asks us to serve with her."

As part of that service, Walton has been assigned by the bishop to serve as a deacon at St. Stephen's Church New Hartford. she However, continue to work at Emmanuel Episcopal Church to provide outreach and support services to the community.

"She's not leaving her position here. She'll continue to be here to help people who need help, and be able to direct them if we can't provide it," said Emmanuel Episcopal Church member Cassavaugh. "Hand Made Muscle – Street Rods & More" exhibit opens at **Northeast Classic Car Museum**

NORWICH – A new exhibit at the Northeast Classic Car Museum entitled "Hand Made Muscle – Street Rods & More" will open to the public at 9 a.m. on Sunday, June 19. The new exhibit will be on display through April 2023.

The museum changes out part of the more than 200 vehicles on display every year in celebration of the first exhibit opening years ago in 1997.

The new exhibit "Hand Made Muscle -Street Rods & More" features 19 street rods in all, with one modified for the drag strip. The first Street Rods were modified to reduce weight such as removing hoods, bumpers, fenders, and convertible tops, then modifying the engine by tuning it and/or replacing it with a more powerful

Guernsey Library and Visions Credit Union hosting public "Financial Wellness Series"

NORWICH

Guernsey Memorial Library in Norwich has taken advantage of the Financial Wellness Workshop Series provided by Visions Federal Credit Union. Workshops will be held in the Library Meeting Room each month at 6 p.m., now through February.

"We're pretty excited to have it coming. I mean, everybody needs this. I don't care how much you know, you can always know more," said Guernsey Library Memorial Connie Director Dalrymple. "[I] encourage folks to come because of course it's very important to take care of, and we're excited to be able to bring it to the community and hopefully get everybody in good financial shape."

Workshops will begin on June 30, and will occur once a month until the final workshop on February 23, 2023. Topics will range from banking basics, identity theft, budgeting, becoming a homeowner, and more.

"Every single month we're going to have a different theme. So since the first one is on June 30, we're going to kick it off with just our regular, general guide to financial wellness," said Visions Financial Wellness

Workshop Schedule:

June 30 - Guide to financial wellness July 28 - Basics of banking August 25 - Crash course in credit September 29 - Identity Theft October 27 - Basics of budgeting November 10 - Holiday spending and saving December 29 - New year, new goals January 26 - Steps to becoming a homeowner February 23 - Retirement planning basics

Samantha Lethbridge, who will be presenting the workshops. "It's basically like an overview of everything, like what it means to be financially well. That means being knowledgeable in banking, having your budget together, having good credit, what all of these different aspects mean and why they are important to an individual so that they can be financially independent."

"Next month we'll just do basics of banks, just learning what is a checking account, savings account, CDs, investments, mortgage, all of those different departments that people know about in banking, but also they don't know about in banking," Lethbridge explained. "Then crash course in credit, so why credit's important. Identity theft, that's going to be very big considering the holidays are going to be coming up. Budgeting, and then holiday spending in November, very important."

The workshops are free to attend, and no prior registration is necessary. Although the workshops presented in a series, Lethbridge said attending all of them is not necessary.

"You don't have to attend all of them. They're all basically just, you come on in and we very much hand hold. So we're not going to start with, if you go to the January one, we're not going to be talking about bitcoin and the stock market and using all of that political jargon and stuff. So it's all going to be very kind of elementary no matter who comes in at what time," she explained.

Lethbridge also stressed that the workshops will be more like a group conversation rather than a quiet presentation, as she wants to ensure attendees are engaged in the material and learn things that are relevant to them.

"All of these are going to be more of conversation pieces. Of course I'll have a nice fancy powerpoint and we'll go through everything, but everybody kind of gets bored after watching a powerpoint for so long. So I like to have an open dialogue, open conversation, get to know the audience," she said.

She added that while each workshop has a set theme, such as holiday spending or retirement planning, if the group wants to focus on different topics that better suit their needs, she can adjust her seminar to educate attendees on what they'd like to know.

'Sometimes it'll be like four people there, or if there's 40 people there, and if I'm talking about budgeting and they don't know how to balance a checkbook, well then the conversation may shift like a complete 180. So it's all going to depend on the audience and what their needs are, because I'm not going to just stand up there and just speak from a slide," said Lethbridge. "I have live people in front of me. I'm going to ask them what they want, what their needs are, and what do they want to learn about?

For those who may miss or be unable to attend a workshop, Lethbridge said all presentations will be available online as pre-recorded webinars, and she can provide links to individual webinars for those who would like them. She said she also

provides her personal phone number and email so community members can contact her should any questions arise.

The Financial Wellness Workshop Series is provided entirely by Visions Federal Credit Union through their Financial Wellness Department, which aims to provide outreach and education on financial literacy in every aspect of the community.

"I'm not selling anything. I'm not doing a pitch where it's like, hev come to Visions we can open you a checking account. We teach people about checking accounts, and we teach them about credit cards, and we teach them the difference between APR, APY, all of that fun stuff," said Lethbridge. "My job is more education-wise, so that way people can make their own educated opinion or decisions on, okay I have this information, now I'm going to go forward and utilize it. Whether that would be at Visions, NBT, you know, as long as they are making a very well educated decision then my job is done."

Visions' Financial Workshop Wellness programs are available to libraries in the area, as well as schools. centers. community senior centers, and more. Lethbridge said workshops can be provided for all ages, from

children and teens to adults and seniors, as well as all group sizes, in person or virtually. She added that she will "make our program work for you."

"I am out in the community helping out after school programs, community centers, libraries, senior centers," said Lethbridge. "We also have like fun little games and story times, and we'll go to an elementary school and host a bingo game, and read a fun story that has to do with money ... [High schools] have their hands full, so we just like to be an added resource and be like, hey, you don't have to add this into your curriculum, we'll come and teach this for you."

"If we can raise that financial literacy in the community everybody wins, because then everybody will know how to become financially independent, and that's the best thing you can teach your children," she added.

> This solar oven works because the cardboard, black paper, and plastic wrap insulate the oven. The heat is trapped in the box cooking the marshmallows and melting the chocolate.

To: All interested Agencies, Groups and Individuals, including the Otsego County Highways, Forestry, and Parks Dept., Otsego County Dept. of Health, NYS Environmental Facilities Corporation, NYS Dept. of Health, NYS Dept. of Environmental Conservation, NYS Dept. of Transportation, NYS Office of Community Renewal, NYS Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and U.S. Dept. of Agriculture Rural Development.

This is to give notice that the Town of Edmeston has conducted an evaluation as required by Executive Order 11988 and 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management, to determine the potential affect that its activity in the floodplain and wetland will have on the human environment for the Town of Edmeston Water System Improvements Project.

The proposed project involves improvements to the existing water treatment building and construction of a new treatment building at the Town's well site, replacement of approximately 14,300 linear feet of existing water main, replacement of existing hydrants and water services, installation of approximately 6 new hydrants, installation of a new water transmission main from the Town's existing Spring Site to South Street (the existing transmission main will be abandoned in place), and installation of new pumps and a generator at the Town's spring site. The project area is located within the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) mapped 100-year floodplain of Mill Creek Floodplains provide a number of ecological functions, including flood protection, improved water quality, and wildlife habitat. The proposed replacement water main along East St, North St, and South St intersect the 100-year floodplain. The water main will be located underground, and all temporarily disturbed areas will be restored to their pre-construction grades and stabilized after installation is complete. Therefore, no permanent impacts to floodplains will result from the project. The total area of the FEMA-mapped 100-year floodplain within the project area is approximately 1 acre. The project will result in approximately 0.25 acres of temporary disturbance within the mapped 100-year floodplain associated with water main installation. The proposed project is located along East St, West St, North St, Bert White Rd, South St, Medbury Ave, High St, Gates Ave, Burdick Ave, Dutch Valley Rd, Heap Rd, County Highway 20, and the existing spring site and well site in the Town of Edmeston, Otsego County, New York.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information about floodplains can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplain, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.


