## Girls Soccer: UV reflects on a thriving 2022 season

**NEW BERLIN** – Despite falling short in the first round of sectionals, the Unadilla Valley Storm girls soccer team kept their heads held high as they celebrated a successful 2022 season that led to a second place finish in the MAC league.

The Storm accomplished beginning goals of bettering themselves from last year where they went from sixth to second in MAC and were competitive against every team. They were successful at beating every team at least once while the losses were close.

The Storm were led by its four seniors, who

each received valuable playing time.

Before a season-ending injury against Greene, Kadence York finished fourth in the MAC with a team-high 11 goals and five assists. Surely, her talent was

missed in the last six contests, especially in sectionals where UV needed her the most.

Coach Jeanine Potter appreciated York's presence on the sidelines as another coach who cheered her team-

mates on and continued to attend practices and games in support.

Aside from York, fellow senior Kailee Figger finished with 10 goals and two assists. She was seventh overall in the MAC in points

scored this season.

"Kailee has played about every position (except for keeper) in her time on the team. She was always willing to do what she had to do to help the team be successful," Potter said.

"A few times this year she was moving from mid to front line, right side of the field to left side and always with a positive can-do attitude."

Potter was thrilled to see Emily Nichols come out for her senior year. Nichols didn't see much playing time, but contributed with one goal and made the most of her time on the field.

Pyper Kneale rounds out the seniors with her contribution on defense. She mostly played at the stopper position, but also helped out at mid or sweeper when necessary.

## Environmental Educator comes home to CNY to enliven Rogers Center programs

SHERBURNE — Environmental Educator and Hamilton native Ellen Rathbone wanted to return to Central New York, and Rogers Center in Sherburne needed someone exactly like her.

Rogers Center featured prominently in Ellen's early years, both on school field trips and as a family destination. At that time Rogers was operated by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC).

"I have great memories of visiting Rogers," Ellen said. "I remember making anemometers out of ping-pong balls and toothpicks, and a memorable overnight field trip with my sixth-grade class."

## EOH presents Grammy Award winner Amy Helm

EARLVILLE — Singer-songwriter and multi-instrumentalist Amy Helm will play on the historic Earlville Opera House Main Stage on Friday, November 18, at 7 p.m.

Her third album, *What the Flood Leaves Behind*, is her most autobiographical yet, both in content and creation, representing a gathering of ideas and experiences, friends and collaborators. Yet, the album also marks a landing - a pause for the traveling musician and mother of two young boys who was seeking clarity in her calling and career.

After making multiple albums and performing in far-flung

places, Helm returned home to Woodstock's Levon Helm Studios just before the pandemic to record *What the Flood Leaves Behind* and reclaim a sense of self.

"Going back to the place where I learned so much about how to express music, how to hold myself in music, how to listen to music," she begins. "It was humbling in a funny way. I could see clearly where I came from and where I am now in my life. I was singing from a different place now and for a different reason."

An impressive group of friends and collaborators joins Helm on *What the Flood Leaves*

Behind. With musical polyglot Josh Kaufman (whose credits range from Taylor Swift's *Folklore* to the Grammy-nominated Bonny Light Horseman) producing and contributing on piano, guitar, and mandolin, the record brings Helm's powerful, emotive vocals to the forefront.

"We tried to make it about her voice and about the musicians responding to her, and not the other way around," explained Kaufman. "I wanted her to feel like she had that freedom to be herself on the recordings and she just filled up the whole room. Her singing was coming from this deeply-root-

ed place of family and music and wanting to convey a beauty."

In fact, Helm considers Levon Helm Studios itself to be "the tuning fork" for the record — an ethereal, elemental component that helped her and musicians Phil Cook (keys, harmonica), Michael Libramento (bass, organ, percussion), Tony Mason (drums), Daniel Littleton (guitar), Stuart Bogie (saxophone), Jordan McLean (trumpet), and her son Lee Collins (congas) summon courage and comfort.

From there, the vivid,

narrative verses swell, building up to a chorus with deep resonance for Helm. She repeats back the lyrics: *What the flood leaves behind is what we've got to make.*

"I like that reckoning," she said. "Of the good and the bad and everything in between." Helm sings stories of life's relentlessness.

# Brian Elder at Dunderberg Gallery

GILBERTSVILLE – The Dunderberg Gallery in Gilbertsville is pleased to announce its December 2022 exhibition, Map, Body, Memory, mixed media and painted works on paper by Brian Elder. Elder is a Professor of Painting and Drawing and Chair of the Department of Art and Design at Central Michigan University.

He was previously a member of the art faculty at SUNY Oneonta and at Hartwick College, among others. His bachelors degree is from the University of New Hampshire, and Master of Fine Arts from Indiana University, Bloomington. Elder said, “My work records our awareness of coming to know a place or moving from one place to another, as a metaphor of our movements, both phys-

ical and emotional, throughout our lives.” Since the early 2000’s, he has employed the technique of collage to fuse disparate elements, both conceptual and material, thereby enlarging our sense of the whole of human experience. A reception and artist talk by Brian Elder for Map, Body, Memory will be held on December 17 at the Dunderberg Gallery, 118 Marion Avenue in

Gilbertsville. The exhibition is now on view from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., Thursday-Saturday. Elder’s exhibition at Dunderberg comprises four distinct bodies of work he has made since 2001. Location: Works on Paper imagines the organs of the human body as a type of location, and juxtaposes their images with maps of various terrains, as “the body of the Earth.” The Nantes Series pre-

serves the process of memory by exploring how we learn new places. Using time and distance as associations through which previously-known places merge with a new one, in the Location series, we watch the details of these images coalesce and fade away. One part of Elder’s multi-media Venice Series included in the Dunderberg show refers to mapping the body of “The Queen of

the Sea,” including her artery-like canals, by changing the perspective and scale of the map, from “the land in the water” to “the water in the land,” with the purpose of developing a multi-faceted experience of the city. Works on Paper 2001-2003 uses the image of the reliquary to explore memory, both of objects and of emotions.

## Thanksgiving reminder from FASNY ahead of peak home cooking fire season

ALBANY – Thanksgiving and the holiday season are almost upon us, and historically, the arrival of cooler weather and more home cooking - especially for the holidays - leads to an increase in home cooking fires. Ahead of 2022’s peak home fire season, New York State has already experienced 118 home fire fatalities, compared to 85 at this time last year; an almost 50 percent increase. The Firefighters Association of the State of New York (FASNY) is reminding everyone of basic cooking safety tips that could prevent a fire from ruining the holidays. “Our state’s volunteer firefighters hope that all New Yorkers have a safe and happy holiday,” said FASNY President Edward Tase, Jr. “When preparing your Thanksgiving feast

and other upcoming holiday meals, remember to take important safety precautions, such as not leaving your cooking unattended. Unattended cooking is a leading cause of home fires that can easily be prevented.” According to the National Fire Prevention Association (NFPA), Thanksgiving is the leading day for home cooking fires, with 1,630 breaking out in 2018 – 250 percent above the daily average. The second highest day for home cooking fires was Christmas Day, with 740 incidents. Following safe cooking practices this holiday will ensure an accident or a preventable fire does not occur. One safety risk often taken on Thanksgiving is deep frying turkeys. It is extremely dangerous to deep fry a turkey, and

can lead to serious burns and property damage. It is integral that the turkey is completely thawed before frying and that the cooking occurs outside and away from flammable objects. FASNY and the National Fire Protection Agency Provide the following tips: Remain in the kitchen while cooking. Whether you’re frying, grilling, baking, or broiling food, it’s always a good idea to supervise cooking directly. Most cooking fires involve the stove top, so keep anything that can catch fire away from it, and turn off the stove when you leave the kitchen, even if it’s for “just a second.” A second is all it takes for a house fire to start. If you’re simmering, boiling, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly and use a timer to remind yourself that you’re cooking. For

homes with children, have the kids remain outside the kitchen area while food is being prepared. Pets should also be kept out of the kitchen while cooking. The safest chef is an undistracted chef! Make sure your smoke detectors are functioning by pressing the “test” button. If needed, replace the batteries, and if not functioning after testing, install brand-new smoke alarms. (If you have smoke alarms with sealed-in batteries that do not function when tested, replace the entire unit.) Clothing ignitions lead to approximately 16 percent of home cooking fire deaths. It is important to wear short, close fitting, or tightly-rolled sleeves as loose clothing can dangle onto stove burners or gas flames and catch fire. Keep the cooking area clean and

combustible materials away from your stove top. Built-up grease as well as oven mitts, food packaging, wooden utensils, towels, curtains, and other materials on or near the stove can catch fire. Deep-frying turkeys is extremely dangerous, especially when done without care. If a turkey fryer must be used, follow these tips: Turkey fryers can easily tip over, spilling hot oil across a large area. Use your turkey fryer only outdoors on a sturdy, level surface that is well away from things that can burn. Make sure to have a 3-foot kid- and pet-free zone around your turkey fryer to protect against burn injuries. An overfilled cooking pot will cause oil to spill over when the turkey is placed inside. Determine the correct amount of oil needed by

first placing the turkey in the pot with water. A partially frozen turkey will cause hot oil to splatter. Make sure your turkey is completely thawed before you fry it. Turkey fryers can easily overheat and start a fire. Check the temperature often with a cooking thermometer so the oil won’t overheat. The pot, lid, and handles of a turkey fryer can get dangerously hot and cause burn injuries. Use long, insulated cooking gloves that protect hands and arms when you handle these items. While Potter and the rest of the coaching staff will miss the four seniors and all their efforts for the UV Storm soccer program, there is still much talent left in the next season and for seasons to come. Potter looks to count on upperclassmen Phalen Hill, Isabella Potter, and Kalie Fernandez-Naughton on the defensive end. Naughton was fierce as a junior goal keeper this season as she had

68 saves and earned seven shutouts this season. Brynn Grant also stepped in as backup. Potter also appreciates Shelby Rose and Avery Hill, who are expected to return next season, in their roles on defense. “Shelby, Avery, along with Kora Johnson and Emmalyn Montgomery, round out a returning defense that this year placed first in the MAC for least number of goals allowed in the regular season,” Potter said. “Defenses don’t always get a lot of notice or credit as most stats focus on the offense, but we are very proud to have only

allowed 11 goals scored against us.” Potter mentioned that Greene and Unatego defenses followed with allowing 16 and 17 goals respectively. Aside from a strong defense, Jaiden Schrag played tremendous on offense in York’s absence. She finished with eight goals and two assists that tied her for ninth in the MAC overall. “Jaiden is a large part of our midfield and works well with her teammates to get some passes in and shots off,” Potter said. Natalie Crandall, Gracie Gorrell, Adrienne Hodge, Myriah Taylor,

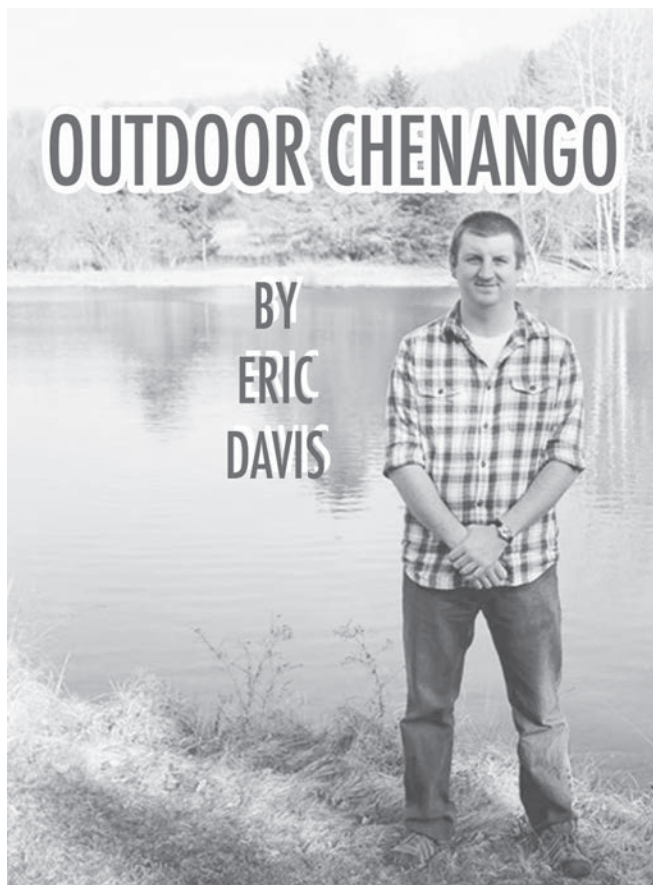
Lyla Taylor, Emma Bonacci, and Natalya Schrag are also expected to return to fill in offensive holes around Jaiden. Overall, Potter and the rest of her staff are pleased with the hard work the team has produced this season. They also hope the ladies are able to put in work in the offseason to keep up with their strong skills. All hard work continues to come from a strong program that anticipates a steady growth. “The youth and modified program help keep numbers up and skills improving. It would be nice to see enough

## The moment of truth and the aftermath



After months of preparation, working hard to put in a food plot or checking

trail cameras to locate your target buck, the moment has finally come.

You see him chasing a doe around from a distance but you get your bow ready just in case. After a minute, she comes trotting through one of your shooting lanes with him lagging behind by a few steps. You draw, get to your anchor point, and settle the pin just behind his shoulder as he steps out broadside into the lane. You release the arrow, he jumps and takes off running.

After about 60 yards, you lose sight of him. Your adrenaline starts to kick in and your heart starts to pound as you try to relive the shot over and over to make sure it was a good hit. If you're like me, you hang up your bow, sit back down (so you don't fall out of your stand), and get your

phone out. Send a text or a quick call to your hunting buddy to tell them that you just hit a buck. Then you try to sit and wait for at least half an hour before getting down to look for blood where the buck was standing when you shot.

Once you get to where you think the buck was standing, you look for signs of impact by the arrow. This could be hair, blood, or your arrow if it passed completely through the deer. Don't be surprised if there isn't any blood because it can take time for it to start to come out of the wound made by the broadhead and arrow. Look for kicked up ground to show that's exactly where the deer was when he jumped after getting

shot. Mark the place where you find the first piece of sign.

I carry a roll of flagging tape in my pack and just put a small piece on a stick and jam it into the ground. If you do find your arrow, look at it and see what is on it. Lung shots will leave bubbly blood on the arrow, heart shots will leave bright red blood. Liver shots will leave dark red blood and gut shots will leave green or brown bits on the arrow likely with some blood. If you suspect a liver shot, back out and wait at least 8 hours before tracking. For gut shots, consider waiting a full 24 hours before looking for the deer.

If you are confident in your shot, face the direction you saw the deer run and scan the ground for blood. Avoid walking on top of the trail so you don't get blood on your boots and smear it all over. If you have to go back for any reason the blood being all over will complicate things, especially if you end up calling in a tracking dog. Look for your arrow as you track if you haven't found it yet.

If your arrow stays in the deer, the blood trail will likely be light as the arrow blocks the hole and doesn't allow the blood to leave the body cavity. Keep scanning ahead as you are tracking. Sometimes the deer will go just far enough to be out of sight before

laying down, especially liver and gut shot deer.

By scanning ahead, you can try to avoid jumping a wounded deer because once the deer gets its adrenaline pumping it can run a long distance before it stops. If you do bump your deer, mark the spot with flagging tape and slowly back out. If you are lucky, it will bed back down and expire there if it doesn't get spooked again.

If the blood trail gets harder to follow and seems to disappear, mark your last spot you have blood and start to make circles around that spot. Make each circle slightly bigger as you make a full one. Consider asking some friends to help you look for the deer.

If the circles do not yield any help, you can do a grid search. However, one of the better options is to call for a tracking dog. If you want to do this, avoid going crazy with the circles and the grid search as the added human scent all over the area can make the dog's job more difficult. In New York, tracking dogs are licensed through the NYSDEC and the handler must pay for their license. However, dog handlers are not allowed to charge for their services. Most hunters though will tip the handler to help pay for the license, the dog food, and the gas to come to the location.

CHENANGO COUNTY – The Chenango County Department of Public Health is hosting a free flu shot clinic on Friday, November 18 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The clinic will be held at the Chenango County Office Building, located at 5 Court Street in Norwich, in the basement level of the nursing clinic.

The clinic is open to Chenango County residents aged 10 or older who do not have health insurance, or whose insurance does not cover vaccines.

Supplies are limited. Call 607-337-1660 to register for a free flu shot.

The single best way to prevent the flu is to get the flu shot. Everyone six months of age and older should get the flu vaccine every year. New flu vaccines are produced every year to keep up with flu viruses that change rapidly over time.

## WEEK #46 TWENTY YEARS AGO

November 15, 2002

With cold weather last week, we had snow for the first time. Luckily the snow did not last very long.

# YMCA Turkey Trot returns for 41st year

NORWICH — The Norwich Family YMCA will be holding the 41st annual Turkey Trot 5K run and walk on Sunday, November 20. The race begins at 12:30 p.m., with a children's run beginning at noon.

Registration is ongoing and will be available up to the day of the event. Now through November 17 registration is \$25, and then increases to \$30. Registration for students is \$20. Participants will receive a commemorative Turkey Trot T-shirt.

"One of the bigger tasks each year, that we usually start working on by early October, is what the participant and volunteer shirts are going to look like. We actually put a lot of thought into the 'look' of that years' Turkey Trot," said Norwich Family YMCA Health and Fitness Director, and Turkey Trot Organizer of 16 years, Shannon Gawronski. "I really love this years' shirts because of the simplicity of it. It simply states that our Turkey Trot is a 'Norwich Family Tradition Since 1981.'"

Registration is available on the Norwich Family YMCA Facebook page, and on their website, NorwichYMCA.com.

Those that would like to participate in the race virtually will also have the option again this year. Norwich Family YMCA Executive Director Jamey Mullen said the Y held an all-virtual event in 2020 due to the pandemic, and decided to bring the feature back this year.

and they sent us pictures out running. We still did a shirt and sent it to them wherever they were. People where in Pittsburgh, and Colorado, you know, wherever they were living that still had ties to Norwich that knew about the Turkey Trot, or saw it advertised, or follow us on our Facebook page. So the virtual is pretty neat to see," said Mullen.

The Turkey Trot is open to runners of all ages. The Kids' Fun Run will begin at noon, starting at the YMCA and heading down Mechanic Street, to Birdsall Street, then Mitchell Street, down Merrill Street, and back to the Y.

"My very favorite part of the Turkey Trot is the Kids' Fun Run that takes place round the block right before the actual 5k. I love to see how excited the kids get to do their own, often first ever, road race,"

said Gawronski. "For many of our kiddos it's the first time they get to run in the middle of the road, push themselves to run the whole big block, and have all of their parental admirers cheering them on. Sometimes it's the start of a life-long love of running. I just don't think it gets any better than that."

The adult's run will begin at 12:30 p.m. at the YMCA, moving in a circle down South Broad Street, to Division Street, to Silver Street, across Main Street to Birdsall Street, up Borden Avenue to Weiler Park, then to North Broad Street, and down back to the YMCA. Adult runners are welcome to bring young children in strollers, or dogs that are comfortable with crowds.

"We've had folks bring their dogs before. We usually ask the dogs and the strollers to stay in the back a little bit. As

long as they know that they can handle large crowds, lots of kids, things like that. We just want to keep them in the loop with that," said Mullen.

The race route will be marked off and supervised by volunteers. Mullen asks participants and Norwich residents to be mindful of their surroundings while the run is underway.

"Use caution, as we are running the streets of Norwich. We do have it marked out and volunteers out, but we do ask folks in the community as well as the runners to be engaged and aware of their surroundings," he said. "Everyone's pretty much done and off the streets by 1:30 [p.m.]."

Following the 5K will be an awards ceremony in the Norwich Family YMCA gymnasium. Mullen said the ceremony serves as a chance to acknowledge Turkey

Trot sponsors as well as this year's top runners.

Several local businesses have also donated food and drinks for the ceremony, including chocolate milk from Stewart's Shops, bananas and bagels from Grand Union, yogurt from Chobani, and turkey sandwiches from Arby's.

"We have been truly fortunate to have so many businesses willing to donate money or products all of these years," said Gawronski.

"The rest of the preparation comes down to the great volunteers that help every year. It would be impossible without their help. The volunteers help me set up the registration and awards area and mark the roads the night before," said Gawronski. "Day-of volunteers help with registration, handing out t-shirts, serving coffee, bagels, handing out waters, setting up water stations and cones along the route, keeping participants safe at the intersections, and a hundred other last-minute details."

There's still time to register for the 41st annual Norwich Family YMCA Turkey Trot. The event not only promotes staying active and involved in the community, but also supports the YMCA in providing athletic programs for all ages.

"I think everyone should participate, whether they walk or run, carry a flag or push a stroller, because it just feels so rewarding to take the personal challenge and to be a part of the great community energy," Gawronski said. "Of course, it also helps fund the Norwich Family YMCA's mission to benefit our youth and so many others in our community. It's simply a win-win for everyone involved."

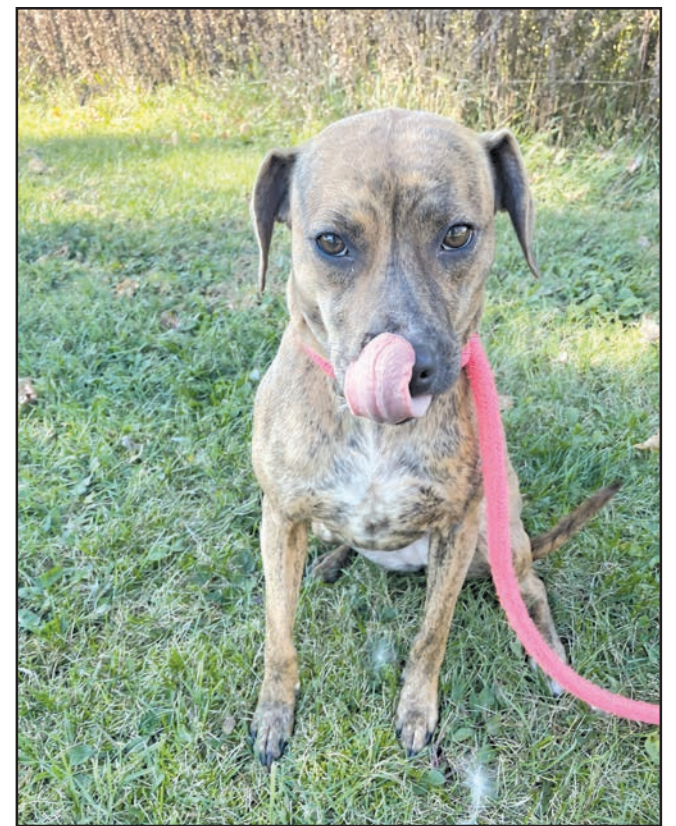
After the American Revolution, lodges began to be organized in many of our local

## NY Troopers search for suspect who stole wood pellets bags in Richfield Springs

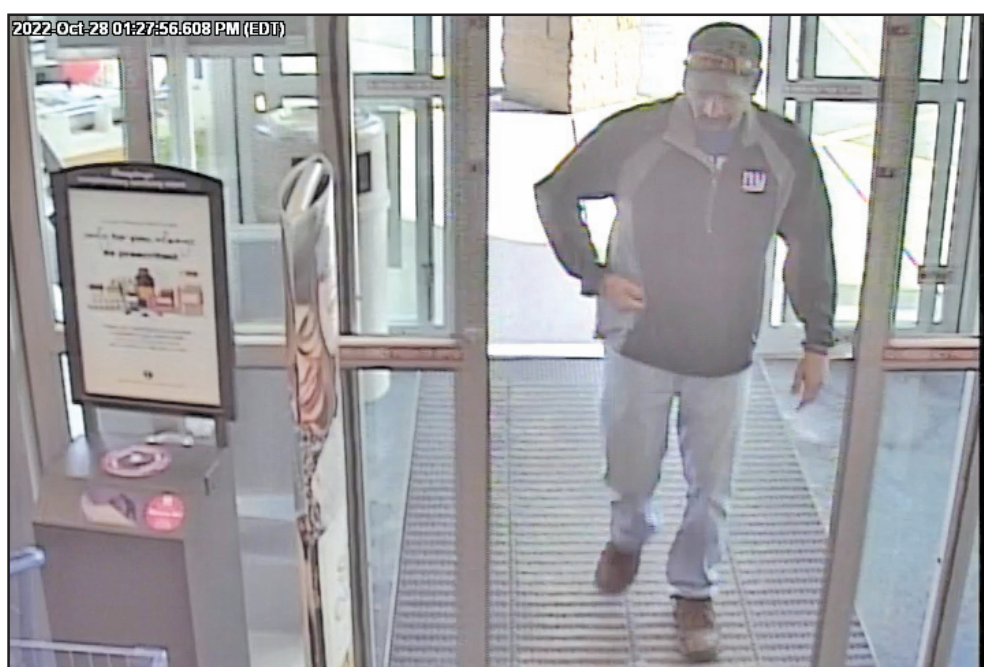

# New BBQ restaurant finds success during tough times

**NORWICH** – Norwich is welcoming the summer opening and success of a new major restaurant and Texas barbecue joint, Dickey’s Barbecue Pit.

Despite the recent economic challenges and changes in customer habits following the pandemic, the business has had a successful start since July. It is now getting ready to expand and offer a drive-through service for customers.

The owners, father and son Armando and Dave Cirello are experienced entrepreneurs in the community and operate two other local mainstays businesses, Fred’s Inn and Park Place.

The men bought a building just south of city limits on Route 12 that was home to a former steakhouse.

They then invested a major sum and had the building updated, remodeled and painted.

The business hired dozens of new employees, grillers, smokers, waiters and other jobs, and now has about 20 staff members.

Dickey’s Barbecue Pit is one of the largest chains in the United States but the owners said all the meals are prepared locally, with many of the meats taking more than 24 hours to prepare and smoke properly.

The restaurant is open from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. seven days a week, located at 5698 State Highway 12 in Norwich, and can be reached at 607-373-4566.

Owner Dave Cirello said he wanted quality barbecue food that local people would like and be a success. He began researching and found Dickey’s offered the best food and options for small business owners and so he began to invest in the idea.

“I was searching franchises and researching different ideas,” said Cirello.

Dickey’s Barbecue Pit is a chain out of Texas,

established in 1941, coincidentally the same year Fred’s Inn was established. “Maybe it’s a sign,” joked Cirello.

One of the reasons the partners selected Dickey’s Barbecue Pit is because the restaurant cooks all its food on site from raw ingredients.

“Everything is smoked fresh daily, nothing is reheated. We absolutely do it all right here locally. We cook, we season, we smoke it, whatever – we just get the raw meat sent to us and we do the rest,” said Cirello.

The restaurant has a 350 pound smoker and many meats are slow cooked, such as brisket and pulled pork, which are often prepared overnight. There

is also a full bar inside the restaurant.

By the end of the month Cirello said he hoped the business would be fully opened for a drive-through service, something he said customers wanted more and more.

Cirello said he did not like comparisons to fast food. Instead he said the services represented a flexibility in meeting increasing customers needs for things like delivery and drive-through, which are becoming exceptions even for regular restaurants.

“It’s not fast food. It is good food served fast,” he said. “That’s a lot harder.”

Dickey’s Business Manager Drew ‘Bear’ Seiler said, “A lot of people prefer to have their extra time now, especially at lunch hours.”

As another example of how things have changed he also pointed out that ordering food online, with an app, was much more common now, compared to before the pandemic.

Bear said, “I think we are doing well. We’ve had a lot of good feedback from the community. Obviously there is good and bad, but we will work the bugs out. It takes a little bit of time to get all the kinks worked out, it’s a normal process and we have done well at that.”

Cirello said the business was occasionally effected by supply chain issues and worker shortages but had learned to adapt menus quickly.

He also said the business had the benefit of a strong employee base to work with, thanks to the success and relationships from their other local businesses. He said it was not easy and some days it takes a lot of time and energy.

Seiler said the business was looking to hire more employees by the end of the month.

“We are grateful for the community reception we’ve received,” he said.

“Thank you.”

The stories, illustrated by E.H. Shepard, were an immediate success, and today the bear with the whimsical name Winnie the Pooh is one of the most well-known children's book characters in the world.

Christopher Robin Milne's stuffed bear was originally named "Edward." He changed the name to "Winnie" after becoming enthralled with a real Canadian black bear named Winnie, short for Winnipeg, that he frequently visited at the London Zoo. The "Pooh" part of Winnie's name came from a swan that Christopher encountered.

Why didn't Pooh want any more honey? He was stuffed.

Why did Tigger call 911? He saw Christopher Robin.

Winnie the Pooh did not begin wearing his signature red shirt until the 1930s.

Knock, knock. Who's there? Pooh. Pooh, who? Well, you don't have to cry about it.

The Hundred Acre Wood was based on Ashdown Forest, located near Milne's home in Sussex, England. Many of the scenes in "Winnie-the-Pooh" were also based on actual areas located in that forest.

What do you get when you cross Winnie the Pooh with a honey pot? An empty honey pot.

The 1958 Latin translation of "Winnie-the-Pooh" was the only Latin book to make the New York Times Best Seller list.

The illustrations of Pooh are not based on Christopher Robin's stuffed bear or the real Winnie from the London Zoo. Illustrator E.H. Shepard based his sketches of Pooh on his son's stuffed bear, Growler.

Pooh's name in the original 1925 story was "Winnie-the-Pooh." The hyphens were later removed when Walt Disney bought the rights to the story in 1961.

Winnie the Pooh has a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.
