Impact Project fights housing crisis in Chenango County

GREENE — On Tuesday, Impact Project Executive Director James Willard III and staff led a grassroots dinner meeting with approximately 70 community members to discuss the future of Chenango County homes and how to save them.

The meeting was at the Wild Owl Restaurant along Route 12 in Greene and those in attendance represented almost every facet of Chenango County including; education, construction, philanthropy, agencies, finance, contractors, media, and local government.

Willard said, “The Impact Project is a non-profit dedicated towards helping people stay in their homes at no or little cost to the homeowner and there are still resources to help more than a dozen families throughout Chenango County this year.”

“What I’m about ready to lay out in front of

you is a real problem in Chenango. The population of Chenango County is roughly about 45,000 people and one to four families are leaving the county weekly,” he said.

“Homeowners can’t repair their homes, furnaces aren’t working, windows need replacing, roofs are leaking and more. The home is no longer safe to live in. Typically, these are the older homes and instead of paying for costly building materials and labor for repairs of which most of these homeowners cannot afford, they decide to leave,” said Willard.

“On our website is a documentary that we partnered with Cornell University last year and at the end of the video, it talks about the topic, ‘The Housing Crisis,’” Willard said, “The real housing crisis- and I’m not saying that because it’s the most important problem in the county, but it is the largest problem in Chenango County by far.”

“Pre-COVID, the working poor were work-

ing day to day, trying to provide for their family and falling short every month. People were struggling. They did not have enough money for food, gas, or to repair their homes. They were on SNAP, WICK, and meal programs at schools,” said Willard.

Willard explained that income, finances, age of homes and building costs are squeezing together to create this situation. Homes in Chenango County have the lowest median value in the Southern Tier. There are a lot of reasons for this, but every vacant home, left in poor repair or no repair, is effecting the value of local area homes.

Preston Town Supervisor Zachary Meseck said, “I’ve volunteered on previous Impact projects and the homeowners said they would recommend this opportunity to others. Although they said it was a little scary doing the paperwork, in the end, they got to keep their

Area Agency on Aging offers local support to elderly navigating public services

NORWICH — The Chenango County Area Agency on Aging (CCAAOA) is located at 5 Court Street in the Chenango County Office Building and offers home and community based programs that provide older adults with access to a well planned coordinated package of in home and other supportive services designed to support and supplement informal care.

Agency Director Heather Felter said, “My job is to help navigate the services for the community and see what we can offer.”

“The overall goal is to

help older adults stay in their own homes and communities as long as they can and provide access to and availability of appropriate and cost effective non medical support services to maximize their ability to age in their community and provide publicly financed care,” Felter said.

Erin Confer is their nutrition expert and she coordinates with local partners for in home delivered meals and they also offer delivery to eight different senior centers. Over 250 volunteers help distribute 1,200 to 1,300 meals a week. Additional support comes from First Transit as they pick meals up from the kitchen and drive them to the senior centers,” she added.

The senior center programming includes; Bingo, evidence based programming (how to prevent falls, how to manage chronic disease, increase activities and manage mental health and programming for care givers), and health promotion and wellness education.

“The agency coordinates with Achieve to bring seniors into congregate sites to socialize, eat a meal and have the chance to visit with someone so they’re not alone in their home. Some people that live in Norwich walk to the center,” said Felter.

Kathy Shelton said, “It was really hard when my dad came to live with us. He needed so much more care and I had no idea where to reach out and find help. My friend told me about home

delivered meals and the senior center but I needed more help than that.”

“By the time I figured who to call and get help, I was exhausted. I was working full time and taking care of my dad

around that. If it wasn’t for another friend telling me about the agency and how they can support my situation, with home aids coming in to sit a couple hours, I wouldn’t

have known. We received both in home care and meals and that alleviated me of a lot of extra work after my full time job," Shelton said.

Felter explained the agency also offers support with legal services including wills, deeds, and support getting affairs in order; application support for home modifications and repairs for items such as safety and general ease of movement to and from, like a wheel chair ramp or walk in tub/shower; phone discounts, internet discounts, home delivered meals, medicaid assistance and programs for caregivers.

"So many people are caregivers, while trying to maintain a full time job, parenting, and trying to navigate resources. Respite care is provided," Felter said.

"Respite services care is for the caregiver that

needs the break. When taking care of an aging parent or other family member, it can be a 24/7 situation and does take its toll. The respite care giver comes in to take over for a couple of hours, allowing the caregiver to get out, take a walk, shop, and relax," said Felter.

The New York Connects program offers services for the elderly helps with filling out applications for SNAP, HEAP, and Medicaid. Mostly these programs are for ages 60 and above.

New York Connects Outreach worker Mindy Cole said, "Just today, a gentleman came in and was concerned about his mail. After talking with him for awhile, I could see he just needed someone to listen to his concerns. I realized he was anxious and offered an Aid to visit his home. I explained how possibly they can help with the mail, house cleaning and other things and also let

hime know we have a center right around the corner from his place, so he could visit with others. He was generally excited about it and looked forward to new people to talk to; he was relieved."

Outreach worker Bridget Corcoran works with ages 60-plus for medical open enrollment. She is one of five workers that supports the need.

Corcoran said, "Some days I receive 20 messages a day. I prioritize the emergency calls first. People hear about us by word of mouth. One person tells their friends and their friends tell another and then it's a trickle effect. I try to encourage people to take advantage of the programs offered as this is what their tax dollars paid into."

"The state realizes it's better to keep the elderly in their homes and they're happier plus it saves the state a lot of money. With the pro-

grams supporting their needs, and aids services offered, the cost savings is extreme," Corcoran added.

Felter added, "The longer someone can stay within their own home and community, the average cost is under \$40,000 a year. Once you cross over and need long term managed care, the cost is closer to \$100,000 a year. So, if we can be that gap to mitigate some of that, to keep people in their homes longer, in their communities and safe, that is a bonus for all."

Coordinator of Services for the Aging, Ted Diorio, started his employment with CCAAOA about two weeks ago. He's in training and this week learning about Medicaid. He'll help oversee outreach workers, program aids, and the programing with the agency and New York Connects program.

Diorio said, "I taught at BOCES for about

ten years. I have a lot of learning ahead of me and heard about this job, applied and so here I am. I'll be coordinating between different agencies to offer people what they need to make their lives easier."

Budget Technician Ellen Cleveland crunches all of the numbers and keeps the budget in check. She explained how she finds different funding streams to pay for portions of someones salary.

"Most of the streams have specific regulations as to the type of service they'll pay for but because Chenango County Area Agency of Aging workers do a little bit of everything, this makes it easy to find the pay for that service," Cleveland said.

Felter also explained Health Insurance and Counseling Assistance Program (HICAP) is sponsored by the New York State Office for Aging. All outreach

workers are certified to help assist in navigating the complicated health care system. From April 26 last year April 26 this year, they served approximately 1,900 clients. Previously they helped 592 people navigate through the Health Insurance program.

"I think our agency plays a vital role to help keep older adults in their homes and in their communities longer and safe. It means we're connecting and maintaining bonds for families and giving them a peace of mind," said Felter.

Funding comes from the state, grants, and taxpayers. Some programs are at no cost to taxpayers.

house."

"I think it's a worthwhile cause because The Impact Project is doing life changing things for people. It's important that other agencies like the Department of Social Services along with the Chenango County Area Agency on Aging are offering support and collaboration to reach out to the homeowners to help them with their applications," he added.

"If the right people hear the message, apply and get the help they need, or if someone is reading this and knows of someone in need of home repair, sharing the information can help so others know this project is out there. A lot of people have been helped just by hearing about it and applying.

"That's one of the magical things about The Impact Project is you see at the end of the project just how grateful people are to keep their house," Meseck said.

Mount Upton homeowner Lillian Chornoma DeCarlo said, "I'm 81 years old and moved here from Long Island years ago. I met friends up here and made a decision to be here. My family was sad to see me go but my one daughter was hurt on a job and when I moved up here, I found her dreadfully ill. We were going to Rochester for her doctors, hotel rooms and sometimes we were up there 16 days in a row."

"Medical situations kept me putting out more and more to those bills and when I had to have something fixed in my home, I had to pay for it but it got to the point I didn't have any money. The roof was leaking and I couldn't afford it and so I thought about leaving. I didn't even know where I was going to go," said DeCarlo.

"I heard about the Impact Project from my church and then I went to fill out the forms. I have to be honest, the form is so detailed and all of a sudden I'm pouring my whole soul out on this paper and I was terrified about making a mistake. I talked many times to a staff member about it and was so scared I'd make a thousand mistakes," she said.

DeCarlo did finish the application and then received the call for the interview. After the interview and review, they scheduled the work to be done. The Calvary Baptist Church in Norwich, Sidney Federal Credit Union, and people DeCarlo had never met before came to her home and fixed the roof in one day.

"They did everything and I have a new roof and no more leaks," DeCarlo said, "I'm very grateful for these people."

"It's real," Willard said, "It's real and here is where we are; 6,000 homes are gone and there are 9,000 more houses to fix. No agency can fix those 9,000 homes all at once. Some of these people are living in poverty, some living in the old homes and they can't afford the building materials."

"There is no other agency in this county that will do what we just did for Lillian DeCarlo," Willard said, "We evaluate homes, interview the homeowner, make the decision to move forward and get the repairs done. If additional repair is needed, we'll get to that too," Willard said.

Willard shared data he collected from Google, United for ALICE (United Way), Cornell University, US Census Bureau, US Facts.org., Chenango County government website, US Data.com, and the US Bureau of Labor Statistics:

13.9 percent of all homes in the United States are vacant and

that during COVID, 61 percent of Chenango County residents were not making ends meet.

Chenango County had 1,600 vacant homes in 1970 and by 1990 those numbers rose to 3,000. Currently there are more than 5,000.

Labor stats reveal a staggering 25.2 percent of Chenango County homes were vacant as of March 31, 2023.

"We want to help this county," Willard said, "Anybody can apply to The Impact Project, we will take an application from anyone regardless of their background," said Willard. "We can't help everybody, and there are services that we don't do but people can find all of that information on our website."

The Impact Project has two primary target populations: families at or below the Federal Poverty Guidelines- can qualify for no cost repairs and updates and families in Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed, (A.L.I.C.E.), who reside in Chenango County- can qualify for a loan program with terms up to \$10,000 on a five year loan with a .5 percent interest rate.

This organization exists because of over 4,000 volunteers in the last 19 years have supported the cause.

LAWN & GARDEN

Spring lawn seeding basics

Spring has sprung, and there are many activities to enjoy now that the warmer weather has arrived. Many homeowners make the most of warmer weather by tackling projects around their properties.

While autumn is a better time to overseed a lawn for new growth, satisfactory results still can be had if seeding is done early enough in the spring. Grass needs ample time to establish roots and grow strong before the summer heat takes its toll. Many types of grass need six to 12 weeks of ideal temperatures and growing conditions to germinate and produce a sturdy grass that will grow and endure.

Seeding can be done to rejuvenate an existing lawn and fill in bare spots. It also can be done to start a lawn from scratch. The following are some tips to help make seeding projects more successful.

- Begin by raking the lawn to remove thatch and any fallen leaves leftover from autumn and winter. Raking also enables you to inspect the lawn for bare patches or matting of grass that may be indicative of a fungus or other problem.
- Dust off the mower and trim the lawn short, especially if it was left long at the end of last season. This will help seed penetrate the blades of grass and get to the soil beneath.
- High-traffic lawns may need aeration to counteract compacted soil. Moss on the ground is often an indication of compaction. Aeration will help with this problem, as it pokes holes into the soil to enable oxygenation that keeps new grass robust and promotes faster growth. Lawn aerators can be rented from many garden centers.

- Spread a mixture of topsoil and compost over the top of the lawn. This will add nutrients through organic matter to the lawn and create a good base for the new seed to take root. It will also help strengthen any existing grass and promote long-term health.
- Test a sample of the soil to check the pH. Grass prefers a neutral pH, but some soil tends to lean toward the acidic side, especially if you see the presence of moss. Knowing the pH will help determine just how much lime per square foot you will need to adjust it accordingly. Liming is a corrective measure and does not need to be used on a healthy, thriving lawn.
- Invest in a spreader to add seed to the lawn. The spreader will have various settings that enable you to calibrate the rate of seed dispersion depending on your walking speed. Fill the spreader with seed and begin to walk around the lawn. Drop spreaders require you to apply seed in rows with no overlap. Broadcast spreaders will cast seed widely and may need some overlap to guarantee complete coverage.
- Spread another thin layer of compost mix over the seed and water thoroughly. The compost will help keep moisture in while the seeds germinate.
- Aim for lawn watering two to three times per day. The seed should be barely dry between watering. After seeds have germinated and established, you can reduce the frequency of watering but increase the depth of the watering to keep roots strong.
- Avoid foot traffic on a newly seeded lawn until the grass is well established.

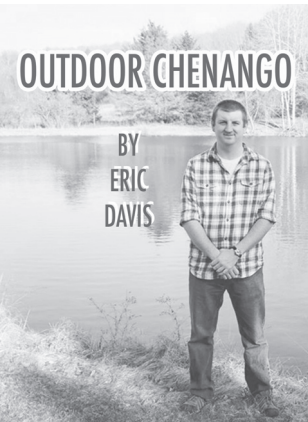

My first turkey



When I started writing this column in the fall of 2018, I wrote a brief introduction/backstory about myself to explain myself to you (the readers) to help you get to know me and to convince you that I know what I’m talking about. In that blurb, I mentioned that I was lucky to have some great male role models that helped me when I started hunting after my father passed away from cancer in 2003. One group of these mentors were still boys back then, but I learned a lot from them.

In 2005, I shot my first turkey on the Youth Turkey Weekend on the Kautz family farm. Todd Kautz was a classmate of mine whom I had played soccer with when we were in elementary school. In the summer of 2014, I ran into Todd in the fishing aisle of Wal-Mart and got talking because he didn’t know that I fished. A few days later, he called my house and asked if I wanted to go fishing for bass at the ponds on their farm. A few hours later, his mom picked me up on her way back from Sam’s Club and we fished two ponds for the afternoon. From then on, I practically became a family member and would go there to fish with the boys (Todd has 3 brothers and a sister). In the fall, Todd stopped at my house and asked if I wanted to go raccoon hunting with him and his brothers that night as his older

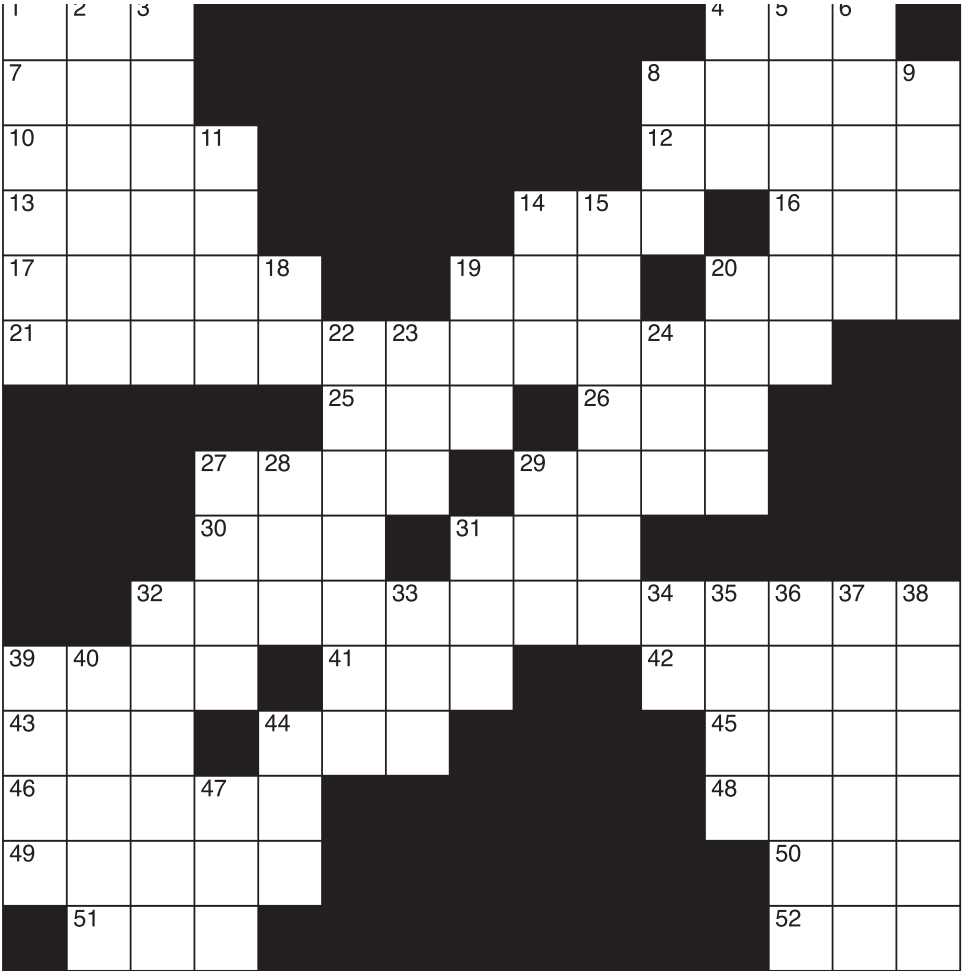
brother had a coonhound. That night, we came back with two raccoons that the dog had treed. When spring came around, Todd called and asked if I wanted to turkey hunt on the Youth Weekend and that one of his older brothers would take me if so. I asked my mom and got the okay. After going out to dinner (my birthday was that week), my mom brought me to Todd’s house so I could stay the night. The next morning, we all woke up and got ready to go out in the woods. Tucker, Todd’s brother, had a game plan to start out behind the barn and make our way around the farm in a big circle until we got into birds. Off the roost we didn’t hear any gobbles, so we started our circle. Tucker would stop and call every so often to try to get a bird to respond. As we walked into a field, we saw a tom in the corner of the field

at about the same time that he saw us. Tucker called to him and he gobbled once as he walked away. We waited a little bit then tried to circle around in the direction that he walked. He never made another sound. Now it was mid-morning and we had walked about half of the 100-acre farm. As we made it back to the road not far from the house, Tucker asked if I wanted to keep going or to call it a morning. I said let’s keep going. We walked up the road farther and cut up into a field. As we got to the back end of the field Tucker called and there was no response. Tucker stopped to explain that he had hunted a bird in that field for a week before harvesting him a year or two before. We continued walking and came to a small pond. Tucker yelped with his mouth call, nothing. Then he cack-

led on the mouth call and a bird gobbled that sounded close! I turned around to see Tucker in a full sprint to get into the woods. I take off to catch up to him and once we are in the woods, he walks me up a tractor path then cuts to the right. He tells me to sit at the base of a tree and then he backed up about 30 yards to call. As he starts to call, the bird gobbles. The bird continues to gobble at almost every call Tucker makes and the gobbles are getting closer and closer. I start to think that I should be able to see the bird coming in soon when I hear some leaves rustling in front of me. Once I can pinpoint where the noise is coming from, I see a black body walking my direction at about 70 yards. As the bird gets closer, I can see his bright red head. As he gets closer, he walks behind a

down tree, so I shoulder my shotgun and turn the safety off. When he emerges on the other side of the tree, I put the bead on the base of his neck and squeeze the trigger. I see the bird drop in a heap and I stand up and start yelling. Tucker comes up and asks where the bird is because he never got his eyes on it. I point in a direction and he goes that way. He can’t find the bird and I start to doubt myself. I try to find the tree he was near when I shot but standing up has changed my perspective so I can’t tell. Finally, a few seconds later Tucker says he found it and I am relieved. The bird had gone into a depression in the ground, so it was hard to see and hadn’t flopped at all. The bird ended up being a jake that sported a beard that was around 4-inches long.

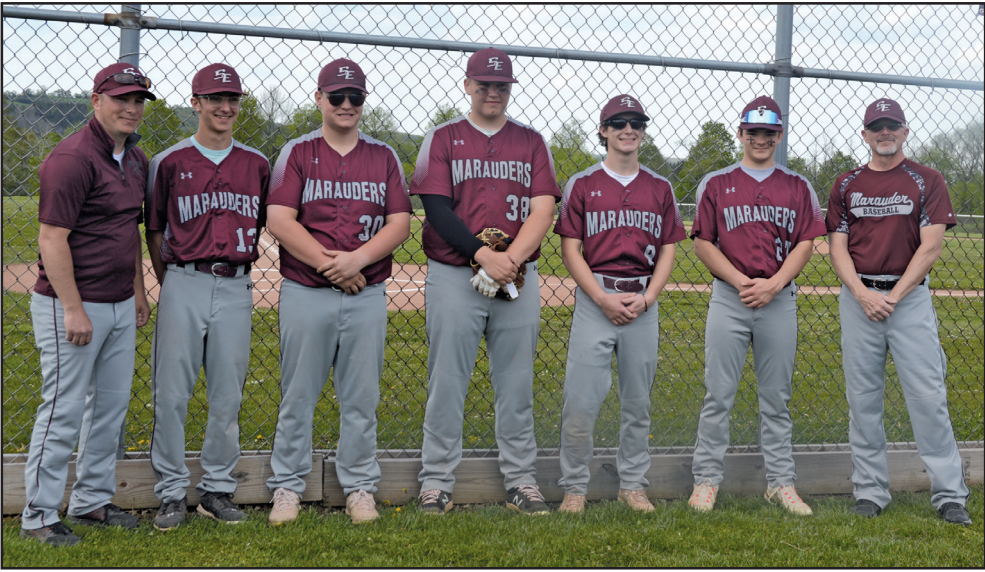
