Farm owner Shawn Zrowka said they're up early in the morning on their working farm, taking care of cattle and putting finishing touches on projects in preparation of opening day.

"We purchased the farm four years ago and then Covid hit and that gave us a stall. I like to say this is our fifth first free parking, mega year," he added.

Their 200-acre farm

has one of the largest corn mazes in the area. Their ten acre corn maze is professionally designed, GPS planted, and guaranteed to keep trekkers twisting and turning in pursuit of a way out. Overall, the time spent inside the maze can range from one to three hours and includes interactive educational games for children.

To reserve tickets, visit creeksidecornmaze.com and choose a day and time slot for the best possible experience. Tickets are \$12 on line and at the gate general admission before 6 p.m is \$15 or \$12 after 6 p.m. Admission for children three and under is free.

Admission includes maze, wagon ride, courtyard games, children play area, s'mores fire pit, cow train, friendly farm animals, multiple photo areas, maze games, mountain, duck races, and tug-of-war.

Zrowka said they get a lot of people out that have never been on a farm or seen farm animals and they revel in watching their eyes light up and enjoying the outdoors.

There are plenty of farm animals including horses, cattle, sheep, and goats and a five acre pumpkin patch provides perfect pumpkins of all sizes. Prepicked pumpkins are also available.

A family play area is complete with playgrounds, Corn Hole, games, and more. Additional activities include Buzzard Gulch Gem Mining, X-treme

Many of these letters came in for weeks at a time following the flood of 2006 to thank the station for their work in staying on air during uncertain times.

Residents may recall the flood in 2006, affecting much of the Sidney area for days at a time. WCDO (CDO standing for Chenango, Delaware, Otsego) was determined to continue to disseminate information to eager and frightened listeners, but they had lost power in their studio. out on the edge of the woods to grab the signal and connect it to their music computers and equipment, stored in the back of an SUV.

They managed to conduct interviews using a tape recorder to grab the information and play it in the microphone, all to keep listeners informed. This included interviews with public officials and the location of safe sites. Stevens and his staff worked diligently to be as helpful and transparent as possible.

Stevens shared another memory from the flood: when police came to him and said they needed him to take action to settle restless community members. Days into the flood, people were wondering if they could leave their homes and resume their everyday routine. At the time, it was not safe, and Stevens was sent out to give them staff members went to a visual and keep them made Christmas for the aways on air to expe-

Stevens thought this was a bizarre request for a radio personality, but he agreed to help convey the magnitude of the situation. The best way for him to express this information was to go out on a rescue boat with a recorder and describe what he sees: vehicles and playgrounds underwater and the tops of street signs peeking above the flood line. "It was one of those moments where I wasn't really thinking about what I was saying, it was just genuinely- oh my god," he said.

Stevens is also proud of the drive WCDO held for the local Toys for Tots in 2013 after the toy storage facility burnt down weeks before Christmas. WCDO was on the air raising money to replace the damaged items and ended up raising more than \$12,000 quickly. This kids and reaffirmed the riences like Water great career this far make it proud.

purpose of radio, to use their public platform for good.

However, when he looks back, Stevens is most proud of his staff. He is proud of them for not questioning the overtime hours and strange requests during the flood, and how efficiently they did their job and informed as many people as possible. Stevens still hears about the positive impact and reassurance the station had during the flood to this day.

He praises Rob Ray, the WCDO Morning host, for having his own legacy as well. Stevens said that he has people come to him and say things like: "I don't know what I would do without Rob in the morning, he's like my alarm clock".

WCDO truly is part of their listeners' days, from playing oldies during lunch hour to doing giveSafari and Broadway in Binghamton. When asked about the importance of Radio, Stevens claimed: "There are so many options to listen to music now, but radio is the only one that gives you constant information like weather and updates. When there's a fire in Preston, can you ask Alexa for updates? Is Spotify going to tell you about the success of the Oxford Girls Basketball team?"

The tri-county heartbeat covers news and local sports. Stevens claims that often, both the home and opposing team listen to WCDO's coverage of their game. The station also posts community events on their website calendar, visit: wcdoonline.com to keep up to date with the station and to listen to the livestream anywhere, even outside the counties it broadcasts

and makes sure that the radio maintains its status as a constant in the community. Not too many stations travel to report on sports games or share local events anymore. It disheartens him to watch broadcasting staff get cut across the country, and promises that as long as he is here, "radio will be live and local".

Stevens said that he still feels a bit of nerve before he goes on air, just like he did behind a podium or a microphone speaking at his high school events. This nerve excites and motivates him to keep doing the work he does.

Craig Stevens' career exemplifies the best that a small community has to offer, and he truly deserves to be recognized in this Hall of Fame. What a way to represent our com-Stevens has had a munity and continue to



### **Preparing Your Traps**



Trapping season will be here before you know it and it is important to have your traps ready to go before you go out in October (or later) to set them. The process of cleaning, dyeing, and waxing traps can seem daunting but can be accomplished if you are prepared for all that it involves.

The first step is to inspect your traps for any problems. This could be mechanical problems such as bent dogs or it could be visual problems like your trap tag missing or having the wrong information on it.

As a reminder, in New York, your trap must have a tag that has either your name and address or your 12-digit NYSDEC ID number (which is on your license). I have gone to the DEC number as I moved during and after college and got tired of removing tags with old addresses and putting new tags

on. Fix any traps with problems before you boil them. This makes it so there is minimal handling of the traps once the preparation process has begun. Once each trap is ready, place a nail in the jaws of the trap unless they are rubber-coated jaws.

Fill a large pot about half to two-thirds full of water leaving room in the pot for the water level to rise once traps are put into the pot. I like turkey fryer pots as I use a turkey fryer to heat the pots. I have seen others use small livestock watering tubs, beer kegs that are cut in half, and other various metal containers along this line.

They are often used over a wood fire and are placed on stacked stone/brick or on metal stands. Add a degreaser to the water. Toilet cleaner is commonly used. This helps strip any old wax off from the traps or factory grease from new traps. Get the water to a boil and add traps to the pot. I wire traps into small groups of 4-6 traps and use the turkey fryer hook to place the bundle of traps into the water. Let the traps sit in the water for about half an hour before removing them from the water. Upon removing the

garden hose on the jet setting. This is because as the wax melts off the trap when heated, it will float on top of the water, so when you pull the traps out of the water, a thin laver of old wax will get on the traps. Repeat this process until you have boiled all your traps, adding water and cleaner as needed. I hang the traps on nails driven into a pallet that is stood up and leaned against a tree or post. This lets the traps drip dry and start to get a coat of surface rust.

After at least a week, fill your pot again with water and whatever dye you want to use. Logwood powder dye is easy to work with but other trappers use sumac fruit or black walnut hulls. Add your bundle of traps and follow the directions for how long to leave them in the dye before removing them. Repeat until all your traps have been dyed, adding water and dye when needed. Be prepared to wax your traps the same day or the next day. Some trappers like to add a couple pounds of wax to the dye water so that as they remove their traps, they get coated with wax.

I keep a separate pot

waxing traps. Heat the pot with wax in it until all the wax is melted and it looks like the oil in a deep fryer. Make sure your traps are dry and don't have a lot of water on them as the water will cause the hot wax to pop and gurgle like hot grease or oil. Slowly lower a bundle of traps into the wax. You will see a thick layer of wax build on each trap as the wax hardens onto the cooler surface of the trap. After a few minutes, you will notice the laver of wax deteriorates as the trap heats up to the same temperature of the wax. Once this has occurred, remove the

that is solely used for

direct sunlight. Once all the traps have been waxed and are dry, remove them from their bundle, scrape the excess wax off the dog and pan latch, remove the nail from between the jaws, set the trap and test fire it. Make sure it fires as a reasonable pan level and under the right amount of pressure on the pan. If the trap passes this, add a cable stake (if you use cable stakes) and place it into a plastic tote.

Remember, do NOT wax conibear or body-gripping traps. This makes them fire easier and can cause you a lot of pain if they accidentally fire when you are setting the trap.

- 6. Add a second rod or shelving to the inside of closets to create more space for clothing and other items.
- 7. Take kitchen cabinets all the way to the ceiling. Store lesser used items on the uppermost shelves and the items you use each on the most accessible shelves.
- 8. Install a shelf over the entryway to a room to utilize this seldom-used space. Shelves also can be custom cut and placed in oddly shaped areas, such as in attic rooms under the eaves or on slanted walls.
- 9. Dowels or curtain rods and some fabric can be used to fabricate slings to hold books or magazines.
- 10. Invest in some magnetic boards that can hold keys or notes by the front door or store knives on a kitchen wall.

# Winterize To Safeguard Your Home From Harsh Weather

Autumn is a beautiful time of year marked by welcoming cooler temperatures and the natural beauty of leaves changing colors. Autumn also has a tendency to fly by, as if the powerful weather of winter simply cannot wait to make its presence felt. With such a seemingly short time between the end of summer and the dawn of winter, homeowners know they don't have too many weekends in between to prepare their homes for the potentially

harsh months ahead. But such preparation, often referred to as "winterizing," can make a home more comfortable when the mercury dips below freezing, while saving homeowners substantial amounts of money along the way.

 Clean the gutters. Leaves falling in fall can be a beautiful sight to behold, but many of those leaves are likely finding their way into your gutters, where they can lodge and cause a host of problems down



the road. If the leaves and additional debris, such as twigs and dirt, that pile up in your gutters are not cleared out before the first winter storm, the results can be costly and even catastrophic.

Winter rain and snowfall needs a place to go upon hitting your roof, and gutters facilitate the travel of such precipitation from your roof into street-level drainage systems. If gutters are backed up with leaves and other debris, then ice dams may form, forcing water to seep in through the roof. That damage can be costly and can even cause the roof to collapse inward in areas with heavy snowfall. Clean gutters throughout the fall, especially if your property has many trees, and be sure to check gutters one last time before the arrival of winter.

- Tend to your attic. Homeowners who have attics in their homes might want to add some extra insulation up there, especially those who recall feeling cold inside their homes last winter, which is often a telltale sign of improper insulation in a home. A good rule of thumb when determining if your attic needs more insulation is to look for the ceiling joists. If you can see the joists, then you need more insulation.
- Address leaky windows and doors. Sometimes attic insulation is not the culprit when it comes to a cold home. Oftentimes, leaky windows and doors are the real bad guys in a drafty home. Fall is a great time to inspect for leaky windows and doors, as the wind outside can serve as your partner. When the wind outside is blowing, take a tour of your home's windows and doorways, standing next to them to determine if there any holes or leaks that are letting outdoor air inside. If you notice any leaks beneath exterior doors, install some door sweeps to keep outdoor air where it belongs. Leaks around windows can be snuffed out with caulk or weather stripping.
- Test the furnace. Homeowners typically do not devote much thought to their furnaces in spring, summer and fall. But with winter on the horizon, fall is the time to test the furnace to make sure it's ready for the months ahead. Expect a somewhat foul yet brief odor to appear when starting the furnace. That odor should dissipate shortly, but if it does not go away, then your furnace is likely in need of repair. But even if the smell does not stick around, you might want to have the furnace cleaned by a professional anyway. Such cleanings ensure the furnace works efficiently throughout the winter.
   Clean the garage. You might not mind parking in
- the driveway during the warmer months of the year, but why subject your vehicles to harsh winter weather if you don't have to? Clean the garage in the fall so you have an indoor parking spot throughout the winter season. Protecting your car from the elements can add years to its life and also saves you the trouble of digging your car out of the snow.

Fall is a time of year for homeowners to spend a weekend or two preparing their homes for the often harsh weather that awaits when winter arrives. FH149472


# How to protect wood floors from inclement weather

Wood floors are a worthwhile investment that can improve the beauty and function of just about any room in a home. Even though wood floors are durable, and new protective treatments help seal out many of the things that may have damaged floors in the past, homeowners still need to prioritize protecting their hardwood floors.

Certain seasons of the year can be more harsh on wood floors than others. For example, seasons characterized by moisture and precipitation, particularly the early spring, winter and fall, can be hard on wood floors. The experts at ServiceMaster Clean say that cold, snowy days can damage wood floors, and Lumber Liquidators agrees that winter weather can be harsh on flooring. Homeowners need not give up on hardwood if they live in an area that sees all four seasons. They just need to take a few steps to keep floors looking beautiful.

- Clean up the salt. Salt that keeps sidewalks and streets clear of snow and ice inadvertently gets tracked inside a home. Hard chunks of salt can scratch wood floors, and, if left to sit, that salt can eventually cause white marks and other stains. Routinely vacuuming and sweeping up salt is necessary to protect wood floors.
- Invest in shoe storage. Wet or snowy boots can create puddles around the house. Have a special mat or tray by the front door where wet shoes can be kept. A nice bench in the entryway makes it easy for residents and guests to remove their shoes until it's time to go back outside.

- Use water-wicking mats. Homeowners will probably need a few extra mats around to tame errant drips and wipe shoes. Any entrance that might be used by people or pets should be protected. Try to avoid petroleum-based, rubber-backed mats, as they could discolor the wood floor.
- Control humidity indoors. Cold, dry air in a home can be problematic because the moisture in the wood can eventually evaporate into the air. The heat will suck that moisture from the flooring, causing it to shrink, creak and splinter and become more brittle. Think about investing in an in-line humidifier for the home's HVAC system that can keep a



moderate amount of humidity in the home. Hardwood floorboards are installed to accommodate minor temperature and humidity fluctuations. This is typically a range of between 60 and 80 degrees F with a relative humidity range of 35 to 55 percent, advises ServiceMaster.

• Use the right cleaning products. Avoid excessive water to clean wood floors, and select soaps that are specially designed for wood flooring. Consult with the flooring manufacturer for a list of detergents that are safe to use. With proper care, hardwood flooring can survive rain, snow and cold weather. FH198119


