New Berlin gets help cutting red tape to secure promised state funding for fire department

NEW BERLIN - After years of bureaucratic delay in Albany, the Village of New Berlin has finally received \$150,000 in state reimbursement funds for its modern firehouse and adjacent community center.

Local New Berlin officials held a ceremony on Wednesday at the fire station marking the decision and thanked state representatives for getting the state to fulfill their commitments.

They said the funding, originally secured more than a decade ago through the efforts of the late State Senator Jim Seward, had been stalled for years due to what officials described as a "political logjam." However officials said New York State Senator Joseph Griffo stepped

in to aid local residents

Peter Lennon credited Senator Griffo and his staff for pushing through the delays and working with the New York State Dormitory Authority to finalize the reimbursement.

ity had been targeted and essentially scripted as early as the last decade," Lennon said during remarks at the firehouse. "We'd been waiting for the reimbursement since well 2020, before thanks to Senator Griffo and his persistent team, we were able to work through the Dormitory Authority and finally get this done. The people of New Berlin are safer because of this, and the quality of life has gone up to the next level."





Drivers should note that out-of-town repairs may require costly overnight shipping of parts so travelers can get back on the road as quickly as possible. Roadside assistance offered through an insurance company or motor club may include tow trucks free of charge up to a certain number of miles, allowing travelers to get their cars back home without breaking the bank.
- Inspect tires, including your spare. Many a road trip has been derailed or thrown off schedule due to a flat tire or tires. Before departing, check the condition of your existing tires, including the spare, as well as the air pressure in each one. Firestone notes that many vehicle manufacturers recommend replacing tires at six years, regardless of tread wear. Tires that get heavy usage should be replaced even more frequently. To determine if tread wear is something to worry about, Firestone recommends the penny test, which involves placing a penny head first into several tread grooves across the tire. If the top of Abraham Lincoln's head is always visible, then your tires are shallow and worn and need to be replaced. But if part of Lincoln's head is always covered, your tires can probably withstand the trip. Worn tire treads can make it hard for tires to safely navigate roads in inclement weather, so don't discount the importance of this simple step.





• Bring along some basic tools. Pack some basic tools, such as screw drivers, wrenches, pliers, a trolley jack, a battery charger, and, of course, duct tape, which may help you temporarily solve some issues on your own. This is especially important for drivers who intend to visit remote locations where mobile phone networks may be inaccessible and the nearest tow truck might be far away. Hone your tire-changing skills before hitting the road and make sure tools are still capable of performing the kind of basic maintenance that might help your vehicle safely return to civilization.





The New Berlin Library participating at Unadilla Valley School's Night of Fun on Saturday, October 18 from 5-7 pm.


The library will have a decorated table and be handing out Halloween grab bags and have a Halloween themed bean bag toss game with priz-
