Chase Memorial staff honored for outstanding quality of care

NEW BERLIN - Chase Memorial Nursing Home & Rehab held a community Town Hall Celebration on Wednesday, November 12, spotlighting the staff whose work led the facility to earn a 4-star Quality Measures rating from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

The designation reflects improvements in clinical performance and care coordination, marking one of the strongest quality scores the New Berlin facility has achieved in recent years.

During the event,

Chase Executive Director Patti Hitchcock received a commendation from New York State Assemblyman Joe Angelino, who presented the honor on behalf of the state in recognition of the team's efforts. Jason Santiago, President and CEO of Good Shepherd Communities, addressed the crowd and credited staff for the their quality care achievements.

Leaders said the 4-star Quality Measures score represents the direct work of frontline staff, highlighting gains in areas such as reducing hospital readmissions, strengthening care coordination, and managing key clinical risks. Chase Memorial also recently advanced to an overall 3-star facility rating, an improvement supported by ongoing staff training and targeted quality initiatives.

Hitchcock told attendees she was proud to see the nursing home's progress—recognized publicly and emphasized that the achievement reflects daily effort from employees—who have long-standing ties to residents and families in the New Berlin community. She said the team remains focused on con-

County board reviews budget proposal and schedules public hearing for November 24

NORWICH - A public hearing on the 2026 Tentative Chenango County Budget will be held at 5 p.m., November 24, in the board meeting room at the County Office Building, located at 5 Court Street, Norwich.

During a meeting on Monday, County Treasurer Bill Craine resented the 2026 Chenango County Tentative Budget to the county board and said, "this is a tax cap compliant budget," with no fiscal stress.

Despite being just under the 2 percent tax cap requirement the proposed 2026 budget is \$121,388,400.74, nearly 7 percent more than the 2025 budget.

The proposed budget does not include an

Commerce Chenango applauds NY Veterans Home in Oxford and promotes community engagement with residents

OXFORD - In honor Veteran's Day, Commerce Chenango and the New York State Veterans Home Oxford hosted a business after hours for community members, residents, families, and staff members.

The New York State Veterans Home Oxford (NYSVHO), is a state long term care and rehabilitation facility, under the auspices of the New York State Department of Health. Founded in 1897, the home has a tremendous legacy and history here. There are 100 other veterans homes state created over time, there are 175 other State Veterans Homes in the country but the Oxford veterans home was the first one in New York State.

The veterans home has grown to 210 residents, 350 employees, and 37 volunteers. Thanks to State policy, NYSVHO residents consist of Veterans, Spouses of Veterans and Gold Star Parents.

Speaking about Veterans Day Commerce Chenango President and CEO Sal Testani said, "It is an incredibly important day in our history. Truthfully, to have a facility like this here in our community that honors and treats those veterans with dignity every day of their lives, is truly an honor and a privilege."

continued, Testani "I've had family members who have been cared for here. It truly is a special place. And so why are they engaged in the chamber? In addition to being a wonderful place that cares for our veterans, it is a tremendous place to work."

The home has contributed to the local economy significantly over the decades and is a current member Commerce Chenango, helping community efforts to improve the area.

According to home Administrator Kurt Apthorpe, the facility

operates on a \$26 million state budget.

"The state covers about 90% of the state employee benefits, so that's another \$10 million input they give to us as well. If you think about it, that is \$36 million that goes into the local economy, real dollars that we use and spend," he said.

The New York State Veterans Home

Oxford placed #8 on Newsweek's America's Best Nursing Homes List for 2026. This is the home's 7th year consecutive year on the list, representing a 55 spot climb since 2021.

Newsweek partners with global data research firm, Statista, to assess and rank the top nursing homes in each state based on four pillars: performance data, peer

recommendations, accreditations and resident satisfaction. This year's list recognizes the nation's top 1,200 nursing homes out of 14,752 analyzed.

This facility is special, said Sophie Liberatore, former President and current Member of the Board of Visitors. When asked what this place means to her, she said, "Let me try to put it into words. My brother-inlaw was here, he passed away here. I started out as a volunteer, and I keep telling people how beautiful it is, how clean it is, and how happy the residents are. I just fell in love with the residents because I love to talk to them."

She added, "My sister was here for rehab when she had knee replacement, and she didn't want to go home."

Liberatore called for more volunteers- people who will come in and help with the commissary gift shop, library and coffee station. These volunteer efforts raise funds for the residents to increase their quality of life through events and entertainment.

Korean War veteran honored with Purple Heart at NY Veterans **Home in Oxford**

OXFORD — Recently, at the New York State Veterans Home at Oxford (NYSVHO), a long awaited Purple Heart was awarded to U.S. Army Veteran Ronald Depersis, honoring his firefight with the enemy during the Korean War in 1953.

members filled the room to support the veteran.

"The Purple Heart ceremony was attended by about 35 to 40 people; it was a surprise," said Scheuer, adding, "He was very happy to receive the award."

His son William Depersis said his dad didn't complain much but said the purple heart was always an issue for him. The family was grateful for the award.

Depersis was wound- nursing care. ed in the Korean War firefight on March 27, 1953 and finally at the age of 93, after years of family members advocating his right to receive recognition, he received the Purple Heart.

Scheuer has worked

at the Oxford Veterans Home for 22 years and noted they started tracking awards about 15 years ago.

She said the Veterans Home is rich in history and has witnessed many awards and purple heart ceremonies.

The NYSVHO is a 242 bed facility located on sixty acres and provides long term/short term rehab, and specialized memory enhanced skilled

NYSVHO is owned and operated by the New York State Department of Health under the direction of a subsidiary department called Health Facilities Management (HFM).

According to the Purple Heart Foundation.org website, their mission is to enhance the quality of life of Purple Heart recipients and other honorably discharged veterans and their families.

The Purple Heart is given to those injured or killed by the enemy while serving in the U.S. Military.

According to the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs General George Washington established America's oldest military decoration as the Badge of Military Merit in 1782. It was re-designated to the Purple Heart in 1932.

sentation by early next year. He said it was not part of the regular budget and likely financed for a 20 to 30 year period, if approved.

He said the current budget was sound. "We want to have reasonable revenue and expense expectations," said Craine. "Last year, sales tax revenue was down 3.5%, this year we have some corrections, and it is ahead." He said they budget about 95% of the previous year's sales taxes.

Craine dove into the overview of the budget, discussing Chenango County's six guiding financial precepts.

He said in 2021, \$7.5 million was added to surplus and \$9.8 million in 2022. Overview of 2023 shows the board appropriated \$11.5 million of general fund surplus for various expenditures and at the end of 2024, unassigned surplus was \$32.3 million; \$1.7 million committed to the upfront Chenango County Office Building planning and design costs.

Craine noted they met this precept for the first thirteen years of tax cap legislation, yet in 2025 the county exceeded the tax cap due to exigent circumstances. "We will meet this precept for the 2026 budget," Craine said.

Craine said the county has maintained a NY State Comptroller's rating of "not in fiscal stress" for all thirteen years it has been in place.

The County Office Building project and new public works facility will be the exception to remaining debt free, once authorized. He said the county maintained a minimum of \$21,600,000 in the Unassigned General Funds Surplus fund.

Craine also explained the surplus balance at the end of 2024 was \$32.3 million and said it helped get the county through a difficult 2020 year.

He said the proposed budget will help reduce debt financing as they begin to implement delayed and impending capital projects.

Craine pointed to inflation over the past 12 years leading to the increase of the minimum Unassigned General Fund Surplus from \$15,000,000 (2012) to \$21,000,000 (2024) and \$21,600,000 an increase of 3% in June 2025.

He said the application

of General Fund Surplus applied to the following year's budget should not exceed \$1,858,000.

Craine said they do not want to apply more than 2% a year of surplus to balance the general fund, and the \$1.8 million will allow them to make a debt payment if they borrowed money for the construction of the new County Office Building and stay within the tax cap.

"This is why we have been adamant about trying not to apply much surplus to the general fund," he said.

"We meet this precept as our application for 2026 budget is at zero dollars," said Craine.

Deputy County Treasurer Shelly Gage said although they are proud to be positive with surplus, it's important to remember it is not always in cash form.

"Unassigned surplus is really the net position of the county and there is money that is in the surplus funds that are anticipated receipts from taxes and things," said Gage.

The expected average tax rate increases is .30 cent per \$1,000 of assessed property value or 1.9% from 2025 (\$27.75 annually per average county residence.)

The 2026 budget also includes over \$25.1 million of local cost for New York State mandated programs.

No 2026 real property taxes have been raised in this proposal to support the proposed building project or the recent repairs at the DPW facilities, said Craine. The county remains debt free with the exception of lease liabilities.

Traffic Diversion Program and bed tax revenues will help reduce property taxes by more than \$190,000. Taxable values are up over \$5.7 million at \$1.932 billion across.

Chenango County maintains a NY Comptroller's rating of "not in fiscal stress".

Caine said, the county's self-funded health plan has a 2026 cost increase of 9%.

The 2026 proposed budget commitment to Behavioral Health, Opioid treatment and Prevention, Restorative Services totals over \$8.7 million, which equates to 7.2% of general fund expenditures.

The county continues to operate school-based Mental Health Clinics in Afton, Bainbridge-Guilford, Greene, Norwich, Otselic Valley, Oxford School Districts, and DCMO BOCES.

Opioid settlement funds in 2022 begin and spending on opioid related programs from 2023-2025 totaled \$1.2 million.

NYS retirement system rates for 2026-2027 increase by about 17.6%.

Increase in interest rates on invested funds added to the 2025 revenues, however it is predicted rates will decrease in 2026.

Overall spending is up \$7.8 million or 6.92% from 2025 total of \$113.5 million and up 39.7% in total from 2015 (86.9 million) or about 3.3% per year. The spending increase is driven by inflation, employer costs and changes in mandated programs.

Budgeted revenues are at robust levels but remain unpredictable. There is a concern for the effect of any economic downturn on sales tax receipts. To meet the tax cap in future years, sales tax revenues need to at least meet U.S. Inflation, he said.

About 31.6% (\$9.7 million) of the local real property tax levy of \$30.7 million goes toward Medicaid.

Other than legally overriding the tax cap in 2025, the county has always met the requirement.

NY State mandated programs require a county to strictly adhere to rules set by the state, which define the scope, eligibility, frequency and level of service, amounts of benefits, etc.

The state also controls the level of funding participation for these mandated programs. Counties virtually have no ability to control the cost of state dictated mandates, he said.

The board looks to not only slow the rate of rise in property taxes, but to lower them and with alignment of the state mandated programs.

The county postponed levying an additional \$492,000 required contribution for Medicaid increases in 2026 by using funds that were put aside in a capital project account.

The 2026 Chenango County Tentative Budget is subject to revision and a hearing is scheduled for November 24.

Outdoor Chenango: The unpredictable rut

Originally, my plan was to bow hunt Saturday morning and afternoon, then to duck hunt Sunday morning due to the rain in the forecast, then go back to bow hunting on Monday and Tuesday.

I got Veteran's Day off as a holiday so I had requested to take Monday off and make it a 4-day weekend. My plans changed Friday night, when my friend called and said they were going to duck hunt Saturday morning now instead of Sunday.

It was my choice whether I would join them or bow hunt like I had originally planned. After some mental debating, I decided to duck hunt with them since I hadn't duck hunted at all in the first short season in October. It ended up being a good morning hunting and I came home with enough ducks to make a couple of meals.

Before going to bed on Saturday night, I checked the weather forecast and the rain was not supposed to start until closer to noon now. I was pretty tired from waking up early to duck hunt so I set my alarm for the morning and said I would see how I feel when it goes off.

I ended up waking up before my alarm went off by a few minutes. After checking the weather forecast, I decided to hunt. The wind was supposed to be coming from the east, which is very rare, and I have a tree stand where an east wind would keep my scent away from the any deer coming from checking a bedding area for does that are in heat.

My preparations for the hunt (I pack a thermos of hot cocoa when its cold) got me behind schedule and I left my house about 15 minutes later than I wanted. I snuck in to my stand just as it was getting light enough to see where I was stepping to avoid breaking big twigs and making a bunch of noise.

Just after 7:00 I looked to my right and saw something shining in the goldenrod about 150 yards away. After a second, it moved and I noticed its tail flicker so I knew it was a deer. I pulled up my binoculars and could see it was a buck as it walked through the goldenrod but it was difficult to see him clearly. He was walking my way so I kept watching and he got into a less thick area so I could see his head better. I could tell he had big enough antlers that I would shoot him if he came in. This prompted me to stand up, get my bow down off the hanger, and spin around to be able to shoot to the side of the stand he was on.

He kept working towards me along the edge of the goldenrod until he hit the corner of the field. In the corner of

the field, I hoped that he would take the trail that runs 10 yards in front of my stand. He didn't though, he turned left at the corner and started to follow the edge of the field, working uphill. I thought he had made his choice and I was going to watch him walk up the hill until I couldn't see him anymore. I grabbed my cell phone and took a picture of him as he was visible in a gap of trees on the field edge.

Right after I did, he took a hard right turn and cut into the edge of the woods about 50 yards away. The buck kept walking through the brush on a line that would take him behind my stand. As he walked behind my stand, I had to spin around so that I would be able to shoot if he gave me a shot. It

was then that I finally got a good look at his antlers, as he stepped out from being blocked by the tree my stand is in and I could see it was a gnarly rack with split brow tines! I told myself to block his antlers out and to focus on making a good shot. He was starting to face away and stopped to sniff something on the ground so I drew my bow. I couldn't believe he didn't notice it and I took a deep breath to relax and focus on executing my shot. The buck spun to keep checking out whatever it was that he was sniffing and gave me a quartering away shot.

I put the pin of my sight behind his shoulder and squeezed my release. My lighted nock turned on in flight and I watched it impact. The arrow penetrated almost to the fletchings and the buck took off immediately. He ran uphill through the woods before circling out into the field and I lost sight of him as he ran across the field. I looked at my watch and it was 7:30.

I have permission from the field owner to track deer on his property so I sent him a text message that I had hit a buck with my bow and that the buck had ran across the field headed towards his barn. I followed up with I was going to wait 30 minutes before I got down to start looking for blood. So I got my thermos out and had a cup of hot cocoa as I waited the half hour to go by. At 8:00, I climbed down and to make my backpack lighter, I went to put a trail

camera up that I had packed in the morning. As I was getting the strap around the tree, I felt my phone vibrate. I fished it out of my pocket and saw a missed call from the neighbor. I called him back but it went to voicemail. As I hung up, I heard the neighbor's side-by-side start up. I could hear it getting closer, so I walked back to my stand, untied my bow from the pullup rope, and threw my backpack on. I walked out onto the main trail as the neighbor parked by my truck.

"Hey, your buck's dead in my yard! And he's huge!"

I walked down and talked to him. He had been hunting on the other side of the road from his house and decided to come back to give me a hand tracking when I texted him. When he pulled into his driveway, he spotted the dead buck. That's when he tried to call me but I missed the call. He told me to drive my truck around the corner and to pull into his driveway to get the buck.

When I pulled into the driveway, I saw the buck laying not far from the edge of the driveway. Finally, I let my eyes look at his antlers and take in the sight of them. The neighbor and I talked about the buck and how neither of us had any trail camera pictures of this buck. It shows how bucks will start moving crazy distances during the rut in search of does that are in heat.

EIGHTY YEARS AGO November 22, 1945

The Board of Supervisors voted to close the Brookside Crest Sanatorium at Sher burne... the eight patients are to be transferred to state hospitals for treatment of tuberculosis.

Fire almost destroyed the farm home of Walter Phillips in Columbus, a serious loss to the owner. Most of the furniture was removed and fortunately the wind carried the flames away from the barn.





Chenango Valley Home to become the county's first assisted living facility

NORWICH - Recently, the Chenango Valley Home in Norwich celebrated with officials breaking ground on a \$4 million renovation to become Chenango County's first assisted living facility.

"This project had been discussed for about two years and it started when of the resident," said the state put a grant out in early 2024," said Chenango Valley Home Assistant Administer Randy Palmer. "We considered it would be a good time to apply for it, we did apply- but didn't receive the funding."

"And when the hospital closed down their assisted living facility, we decided we needed to do this," said Palmer.

He said the home will be changing their licensing to an ALR, Assisted Living Residence, which will allow a higher level of support for seniors, ensuring their safety and proper care of residents in the facility.

"Helping them age in place and stay closer to family members in their community," Palmer added.

"Right now, just being an adult care facility, we can't even place a bandaid on someone that has a cut or change colostomy bags," Palmer continued."That will change with the new licensing."

Palmer explained they are allowed to accept people into our adult home to a certain level of care, but once it reaches a certain threshold they cannot stay there or be entered into the facility. Once the home is an assisted living home, people will be able to stay longer and they will be able to provide rehab care instead of sending them to a different facil-

"We are anticipating the monthly cost for residence will be between \$4,500. to \$6,000, depending on the needs Palmer. "Regional nursing homes seem to range anywhere between \$11,000 to \$13,000 a month."

He noted each individual will have their own refurbished room with a private bath, three meals a day, snacks, activities, medication oversight, transportation, personal care and at nursing facilities they generally have shared rooms, more like a hospital environment.

He said the project will also construct a community room and front porch, giving residents an independent lifestyle.

Palmer said the project is partially funded by community donations and local organizations with the home covering additional costs and will continue to rely on donations, raising money, and a possible line of credit with a completion date slated for 2027.

The Chenango Valley Home has a history of patient care for 128 years and is a distinguished 501(c)3 non-profit home for adults, licensed by the New York State

Department of Health. According to their website, their mission is to provide an exemplary adult residence experience in the community, fostering a balance of independence, security, and comfort to those they serve.

5 fun gift exchange ideas

Gift-giving is a significant component of the holiday season. Families can embrace traditional gift-giving, but those who want to add a touch of whimsy to gatherings with loved ones can consider these five creative and fun ways to exchange gifts.

- 1. Play the plastic wrap game. Host a make-and-take craft party.** With this type of exchange, participants will engage in some form of crafting for the duration of the event, whether it'spottery, painting, epoxy resin pouring, or even knit crafts. At the end of the night everyone can swap their creations with another or keep their own crafts as gifts.


