With last minute touchdown UV Storm grasps late win over Greene

GREENE - It took about a quarter to warm to the task of playing football in March, but the Greene Trojans and Unadilla Vallev delivered a barnburner Friday night on the eve of spring.

The Storm, led by quarterback Kyler Butts, drove for the winning touchdown with 1:28 to play, and held off a late Greene drive in a 26-20 victory at George L. Raymond Field on Friday night.

Butts had a day - a really good day - rushing for 217 yards and two touchdowns, but it was a 12-yard hookup with Colin Gilbert that provided the winning margin.

Butts also found Gilbert on a 35-yard TD pass to open the scoring.

"Their quarterback was the difference in the game," said Greene head coach Dave Gorton. "He broke tackles and broke contain, but he also showed nice patience finding the open receiver. We'll have to do a better job against him when we play them later this year."

Ward School No. 2 assessment supported by Preservation League of NY

ipation of Ward School No. 2's 125th anniversary later this year, the Chenango County Historical Society (CCHS) has been given a Technical Assistance Grant (TAG) to help fund an assessment of the historic structure.

Awarded by the Preservation League of New York State and its program partners, the grant supports a Limited Building Condition Assessment currently being conducted by The Chazen Companies.

"We are incredibly grateful to the Preservation League and its partnering organizations for this grant,' said Joseph Fryc, CCHS operations manager. "The building condition assessment of Ward School No. 2 is a project that has been on our radar for quite some time, and with these funds we can finally take the critical first step in giving the building the love it deserves."

Through this process, CCHS aims to better understand the longterm preservation needs of the facility, ensuring that the historic site remains the home of the organization for future generations. The assessment will also help determine the feasibility of future building improvements in order to better accomplish the mission of CCHS.

"Our goal is to provide the best experience pos-

NORWICH – In antic- sible to our guests here at CCHS," said Fryc. "We hope that there will be many exciting improvements in our future that will bring us closer to achieving that goal."

The Preservation League of New York State and its program partners at the New York State Council on the Arts, Robert David Lion Gardiner Foundation, and Hudson River Valley National Heritage Area awarded \$96,644 to 26 projects, spanning 18 counties across New York state as part of their 2020 TAG cycle. The purpose of the TAG program is to support a number of cultural nonprofits and municipal entities that steward historic buildings throughout New York state in preserving and maintaining the heritage and structural integrity of their sites.

Since the program's launch in 2012, TAG has provided support to nearly 155 preservation projects.

First established in 1939, CCHS received an absolute charter in 1956. Ward School No. 2 was acquired in 1958 with renovations beginning immediately. Since reopening as a museum in 1962, the former school's campus has been home of the CCHS for more than five decades. The primary organization dedicated to actively and comprehensively preserving the history of Chenango County, CCHS celebrates local culture unique traditions, noteworthy residents, and unusual stories.



Spring Whiskers



If you asked a few people for a sign that spring is here, you would likely get a handful of answers that get repeated. Flocks of robins in the yard, hearing Canada geese on their northern migration, daffodils popping up, and the final disappearance of the compacted snow piles left from plowing all are signs that people use to gauge that winter is finally in the rear view.

Another sign of spring that many anglers look forward to is bullhead fishing. While it is not an early spring activity, the bite can get crazy in a hurry. Bullheads head to the shallows where the water warms up faster which brings more food sources, and they

school up ahead of their spawning season in late spring when the water temperature reaches 70 degrees.

Bullheads are easy to catch and do not require fancy equipment so almost anyone can give it a try without investing a lot into it. Since they do not get overly big, a medium action rod is all you need. Load your reel with 8-pound test line and you are good to go. As scavengers, bullhead will eat about anything so bait can vary from chicken livers to leeches but nightcrawlers are the most popular option. Use a number 6 hook on a snelled leader in case the fish swallows the hook too far, that way you can grab another leader and hook to keep

PRESSMAN WANTED fishing. Retrieve the swallowed hook when you clean you catch at home. Some anglers like to fish their bait close to the bottom while others prefer to use bobbers to better see when they get a bite.

While they can be caught during the day, bullhead fishing is mostly done from sunset into the wee hours of the night using lanterns or flashlights. Consider using a bell on the end of your rod to let you know when a fish is biting in the dark or use a lighted bobber. Some other gear to bring with you is a chair, a stick to set your rod on, needle nose pliers in case of deep swallowed hooks, and a bucket or cooler to carry your catch home in.

locations Popular for catching bullhead include inlets into bodies of water such as creek mouths. A common tactic is to fish the mudline. The water coming into the lake is often muddy from runoff or spring rains and makes a distinct line compared to the clearer water of the lake. Fishing on the line where bullhead roam looking for easy food that is brought in from the flowing water puts your bait in prime position to get eaten. If fishing from shore, you want to be fishing in 3-4 feet of water.

Handling bullheads is where some people have issues. Armed with barbs in their pectoral (front) and dorsal (top) fins, they can cause a lot of pain. Grab the fish from the top directly behind the gills being sure to compress their pectoral and dorsal fins against their body. Then use your other hand to work your hook free. Many people enjoy eating bullheads that they catch. Make sure to clip the barbs from the fins when cleaning vou catch. Bullhead can be prepared with the skin on or with the skin removed. Battered and fried is a common cooking method but using a smoker to cook the meat is a growing trend. So if you are looking for something new to try this spring and want to get outside where you can hear the chorus of spring peepers, look into fishing for bullheads.

Sheriff's office: Inmate found dead of blood infection in his cell

NORWICH – On Thursday Chenango County Sheriff Ernest R. Cutting announced the death of an inmate at the Chenango County Correctional Facility, who was found non-responsive in his bunk on Wednesday.

According to the sheriff on March 17, at about 1:30 a.m. Chenango County Correctional Officers discovered an unconscious male inmate on his bunk, inside his cell.

The inmate was identified as 22-year-old, Dillin R. Button.

Button was brought to the Chenango County Correctional Facility on Monday, March 15, by the Norwich City Police Department after he was arrested on a court warrant for seventh degree criminal possession of a controlled substance.

"Correctional Officers made several attempts to awake Mr. Button, followed by performing life saving measures. Members of the Norwich Fire Department responded to the scene and continued CPR on Mr. Button. He was later pronounced deceased, and an investigation into his untimely passing was initiated," stated Cutting.

The sheriff's office reported that on



Thursday morning an autopsy was performed at Lourdes Hospital in Binghamton and Dr. Robert Stoppacher who ruled Button's death as a result of a bacterial blood infection of the heart (Endocarditis) and pneumonia.

"During the course of the investigation, it was determined that approximately two weeks prior to his incarceration, Mr. Button responded to a hospital and was diagnosed with a bacterial blood infection and pneumonia. Mr. Button checked himself out of care before receiving complete treatment. Medical documentation stated that Mr. Button risked death if he left the hospital without treatment," further reported the sheriff's office in a statement.

"The sheriff's office expresses our sincere condolences on the shared loss," said Cutting.

Upon receiving notification of the incident Wednesday, Cutting said he and Chenango County Undersheriff Daniel Frair immediately responded along with members of patrol and the detectives division.

The sheriff's office was also assisted with the investigation by the NY State Police BCI investigators.

During the immediate investigation the sheriff said 31 inmates and 10 sheriff employees were interviewed. The investigation is ongoing and additional interviews are being conducted.

110 YEARS AGO

One year ago, the Coronavirus entered our lives and changed our community forever. Businesses were closed, schools transitioned to remote learning, and we all learned exactly how far six feet measured. Fear, anxiety, and depression set in for many of us as we were forced into isolation, unable to see our family and friends.

While the recent announcement by Governor Cuomo to increase capacity at restaurants to 75% is a positive sign for our community, it also highlights the inconsistent decision-making by the Governor. If indeed we are relying on science and data to inform decisions, then why would the Governor continue to restrict capacity at YMCAs when contact tracing has shown that zero cases of COVID-19 originated at the Y, with just .004% of visitors having tested positive?

At our Norwich YMCA, we have had 30,000 membership scans between September 2020 and February 2021, a 57% decrease during the same time period of time last year. Within New York State, during the same time period, there have been 2,607,409 visits at YMCAs with 109 positive cases documented at Y's while at the Norwich Y, we have had two known reported cases regarding a member that had Covid during the last six months. The most important statistic to highlight is that there have been ZERO reported cases originating at a YMCA in New York State.

After keeping our health and wellness activities closed for nearly six months, and enforcing onerous capacity restrictions, the Governor must afford YMCAs with equal opportunities that other industries already have. YMCAs are fighting for their survival, seemingly on an uneven playing field. In 2020, YMCAs in New York State lost an estimated \$275 million in revenue. These losses, coupled with a statewide 71% decrease in usage, have threatened our ability to provide programs and services to our community and especially those that rely on our services, the vulnerable, families and seniors.

Safety continues to be our foremost priority. Increasing capacity at YMCAs will allow more New Yorkers to have a safe place to improve their physical and mental wellbeing. Studies are already indicating that obesity is increasing in children and adults by almost 8% from last year alone, and mental health may be the next pandemic that impacts generations.

At the Y, we are prepared to tackle these challenges and help our community with all our might, but until we are able to open our doors to more people, YMCA's will continue to struggling to survive. At your Norwich YMCA, we have worked very hard to weather the fiscal and operating challenges of 2020, but 2021 will be our greater challenge as we are open but with restrictions still in place and limitations on programming. With decreased members and programs our membership and program revenue will not keep up with the operating costs. We have been a steward in our community for 159 years and we will continue to work hard and diligently for our members that need us.
