A Dedication to Kevin Vibbard Sr.: 36 years as S-E boys' basketball coach

The Sherburne-Earlville basketball community celebrated the coaching tenure of Kevin Vibbard Sr at the end of the 2023-2024 basketball season. A valuable man who spent 33 years teaching at the S-E school district and 36 memorable years coaching the boys' basketball team. A man who has seen in all from the home side of the Sherburne-Earlville high school gymnasium.

Vibbard Sr. took the S-E boys to seven Center State Conference championships, the most in school history within a seven year stretch (2011-2017) and won about 250 games in his coaching career, most in S-E school history. He also had one undefeated 2006-07 team that went 21-0 and then lost in the sectional semi-finals. Vibbard will be remembered for a lifetime while his dedication is unmatched at S-E.

Vibbard devoted countless time to basketball, where he established the Dave Dolly Youth Program, the S-E Optimists program, and even runs a summer basketball camp for the future basketball stars of Sherburne-Earlville. He's also had the pleasure of working alongside his son, Kevin Vibbard Jr. for the past few seasons, where the two shared a inseparable bond that will be missed.

"I learned a lot more from my dad than I realized," Kevin Vibbard Jr. said. "The amount of passion, heart, and soul he puts into everything is amazing and the effort to build up a basketball program is everything. It takes a program to support the youth and the community and he did just that. I was glad to be given the opportunity to come home, teach, and to coach with my dad."

Vibbard Sr. grew up on a dairy farm, where when he wasn't doing his chores, he was big into playing sports and put his focus on that. He then started out his coaching career straight out of college. He received a call in April of 1988 from S-E athletic director at the time, Marty Gronwall, who was Vibbard's coach at Edmeston, asking if he could student-teach and had an interest in coaching. From there, Vibbard began in September of 1988 and coached basketball ever since. His first team was a freshman team that went 13-1 with only six players. Over his tenure, the roster numbers grew and the support for Vibbard was evident with joyful kids and a supportive community from his first to his last team.

He enjoyed working with every kid he coached and appreciated how committed his players were and made the effort to show up and work hard. He knew, especially

from his last group, every kid wanted to succeed.

Vibbard Sr. will never forget the 2014 sectional semi-finals game, which was to him one of the best moments in S-E basketball history, which included the girls' team. The boys and girls teams played in a doubleheader where the girls defeated Bishop Luden in overtime and the boys won against Bishop Grimes.

"It was great to see little Sherburne up against the Syracuse schools," Vibbard Sr. said. "The gym was rocking and packed. It was a great atmosphere and a great night for both teams. The community really stood behind us and were great supporters, like they are today. We cannot thank them enough."

These teams went on to the Sectional semi-finals at Onondaga Community College, where Vibbard remembers one side being full of S-E fans. S-E boys have never been to the sectional finals, but had gone to four sectional semi-finals under Vibbard Sr

Sharing the responsibilities with his son, Kevin Jr. was very special to Vibbard Sr. He became emotional because of how special the opportunity was and how much he loves his son, whom he said he is definitely ready to take over the program.

"He has a very good basketball mindset," Vibbard Sr said about Vibbard Jr. " He gets along great with the kids and had a different perspective that I needed from time to time, so it worked out great. I couldn't ask for a better assistant coach."

Vibbard Sr. knows that the Sherburne-Earlville basketball program will only get stronger from this point forward as the coaching staff are ready to return and the players are working hard in the offseason.

Vibbard Sr. stepped up in many ways for his team and his community that it was only right and well-deserving for him to have the S-E high school gymnasium named after him in his honor.

"It is always nice to be recognized," Vibbard Sr. said. "I was shocked and humbled to have this honor and owe a lot of credit to Brad Perry (Principal and Athletic Director), Superintendent Robert Berson, and my coaching staff for that."

While he steps away from the coaching role, his heart is always with Sherburne-Earlville and you can bet he will be cheering on his players from the stands.

"We had good experience coming back and the team success and good record this year was like icing on the cake," Sherburne-Earlville wrestling coach, Greg DuVall said. "After losing the first duals, it lit a fire in us and woke us up to know we needed to adjust and we responded. It was the first time in my three years of coaching that the kids understood what it meant to wrestle as a team. What you do on the mat affects the team and kids started to catch on from that. From there, we just kept rolling and every dual meet, we were solid from top to bottom."

DuVall on Expectations for next season:

"We are only losing two seniors this year, so we are bringing back a lot of starters, so I expect us to be tougher and better," DuVall said. "We put a lot of work in the offseason last year and the results paid off, so we are looking to repeat that. We are very goal-oriented and now on the same page and just need to stick the basics of what got us to this point."

"Selina is one that bought into the program and had a great offseason in the weight room and on the mat, moving up a weight class," Sherburne-Earlville Wrestling coach, Greg DuVall said. "She was really strong on the mat and was in the toughest 145 weight class for boys and it was great to watch her take fourth in the boys class to qualify for sectionals. She is a vocal leader who works hard and leads by example and a great role model to the girls on the team."

DuVall on her legacy at S-E and for girls wrestling:

"We have a lot of girls on our youth team, so Selina has stopped in to a few pee-wee practices and the girls just look up to her and believe that they can do what she did," DuVall said.

"At Sherburne, my favorite memories were always before the dual meets or tournaments on the bus," Selina Moore said. "We always feel like one big family and everyone is talking with each other. On the wrestling team, I've learned to never give up and to stick with my teammates. Getting through the wrestling season is just mentally preparing me for the real world and its issues that it could throw at me."



"Jackson had some experience coming in from his time on the Oxford/Greene wrestling team last year. It was remarkable to see him come back from having a losing season to accomplish so much this year," Sherburne-Earlville wrestling coach, Greg DuVall said. "He's taken a lot of people by surprise as no one knew him at the seeding meeting and then made it to the finals. He was the only wrestler in Section III to place in the top eight in his weight class. He is an absolute joy to have on the team and is very coachable. I'll show him detail and different techniques and then he will go out and hit in the next tournament. It is very hard to do that and to find a kid that just has that coachable ability."

"Landon is more of a silent leader but leads through example," Sherburne-Earlville wrestling coach, Greg DuVall said. "He's there every single day. He puts his head down and gets right to work and the kids see that and see his results and it makes them want to buy in to the process."

DuVall on Landon's Expectations going into his senior year:

"I'm extremely proud of him for such an incredible year and making it on the podium at states this year," DuVall said. "He is getting right back into it now and hardly takes any down time, so our goal is to make it back to states and take it all and that will only come with putting in the work over the summer. It's all about doing the right things on and off the mat."

"We definitely have to feel a big void as Hannah led us in scoring for the last few years," Franklin said. "She will be playing for Nate Lull's Amarillo team and then will be continuing on in college in New Hampshire."

"Braeden has been able to set goals for himself and work on achieving said goals with the help of his teammates and a wide range support system," Jacob Preston, OV boys' basketball coach said. "He is not just a great basketball player, but is a responsible and respectful young adult. He is always willing to listen and work hard, even in the offseason."

Preston on Braeden's 42 point game, where he became all-time leading scorer:

"He knew going in, as we all did, that we needed to win this game and the last few games to make sectionals," Preston said. "He came to play and was focused and knew he need to carry the load for us and accepted that role."





Devon Hartwell Gilbertsville-Mount Upton Boys' Basketball Senior

- Achieved 1,000 points on Feb. 15- 15th player in GMU school history
- Finished high school career with 1,008 points
- Broke GMU's single-game record for points (48) on Dec. 15
- Broke GMU's single-game record for three-pointers (10) on Dec. 15
- Averaged 24 points this season

"Devon's love for the game of basketball and leadership grew over the last two years," Cameron Race, GMU boys' basketball coach said. "He was a lone senior on a young team, so he had to step up and lead on all aspects. We knew we needed to put the ball in his hands at all times and he was our go-to for bringing the ball out."

Race on Devon's 1000 point milestone:

"We were unsure about reaching it at the start and he really wanted to achieve it. Midway through the season, he had a stretch, where he was only having 15 point games and it looked to be out of the picture. After Christmas, he went on a big terror and was having multiple games in a row with 30 plus points. We knew then it was achievable and most of the kids were more focused on the number than he or I was. We were grateful that he achieved it earlier in the game than expected in our final game of the season against Cherry-Valley Springfield."

Race on the legacy Devon leaves behind:

"Devon leaves behind an attitude of working hard and when he wasn't there, we weren't the same. He leaves behind the love of basketball and we want other guys to love it too, so it's going to be tough to fill the void of someone who wants to be there as much as he did."


Horan on Ava's expectations for next indoor season:


Gorton on being named MAC girls' coach of the year:





Hamilton on Meade's team leadership:




