With the 2024-2025 winter sports season in the books, we wish the student-athletes much success for the rest of the school year and beyond.



S-E's Greg DuVall named Section III, Division II Wrestling Coach of the Year

SHERBURNE – Following the conclusion of the 2024-25 Section III Wrestling season, the coaches and staff voted and selected Sherburne-Earlville's Greg DuVall as the division II coach of the year.

"It definitely means a lot," DuVall said about receiving the award and recognition. " As a coach, I coach for the love of my athletes and wanting them to achieve their personal goals and our team goals. At the same time, it is nice to be recognized for the dedication and time I have given to the kids. It's all about the kids, but it is nice to be recognized."

This season, DuVall and the Sherburne-Earlville Timberwolves finished with an impressive 15-1 record, which included winning six tournaments and securing the Center States League title. The team finished second in the Section III, Class C tournament but went on to win the Section III, Division II championship. Additionally, they reached the state quarterfinals in the NYSPHSAA Division II dual meet championship. These accomplishments highlight a remarkable season for DuVall and his team. These achievements are just the latest milestones in DuVall's successful coaching tenure with the Timberwolves.

"I feel I have always had intensity and pride for our sport and our wrestling program," DuVall said after completing his fourth year as Varsity head coach. " Our program puts a lot of time and effort into our off-seasons. I am a true believer, that regardless of where you are at in the sport, you can always learn from others. I take our


wrestlers to a lot of top-notch clinicians in the Spring, Summer, and Fall and I learn as much as they do at these events. Each year, I look to incorporate various techniques into our practice plans."

DuVall also emphasized the importance of focus and perspective within the program: "Focus and discipline are cornerstones of our program. This year, we took a lot of time to focus on perspective – the difference between 'having to' and 'getting to.' There is a big difference between having to perform, having to rise, and having to compete at our best. As a team, we strive to have the mentality where we get to perform, get to rise, and get to compete at our best."

DuVall also expresses his gratitude to his wife, April, and the coaching staff, including his father, Paul DuVall, for their unwavering support and dedication, allowing him to continue to do what he loves.


" My wife, April, as I spend a lot of time away from our family to help other people's kids. She is understanding and fully supportive of my coaching responsibilities and beyond," DuVall said. " I'd also like to give credit to my coaching staff for being one of the best in the state. We set a tremendous atmosphere in our practice room day in and day out. We all lead by example."

- Finished 15-1
- Won the CSC League Tournament and the Section III, Division II dual meet championship.
- Reached the NYSPHSAA Division II Dual Meet Championship quarterfinals.
- Had two individuals qualify for states: Drew Telesky and Landon Andrade.
- " A huge focus was placed on perspective and how to look at competition and wrestling events this season," Greg DuVall said. "We also focused a lot on controlling the controllables. Not stressing about the things outside of our

control. Not focusing on the results, rather focusing on the process and on our wrestling. Focusing on the one percent, small improvements each day. "From a practice stand point, my Dad, Paul DuVall, and assistant coach, Matt Telesky, added valuable technical and mental adjustments. It was a total team effort getting these athletes ready for competition."

"I felt the total willingness to buy into this system from everyone. All wrestlers. All coaches. You could sense it in the air, the kids knew we were champions. We practiced like it, we focused on it, and we became it. This team had the belief that we could beat any team across the state."

"Although we lose seven seniors this season, we bring back a good amount of juniors," DuVall said on the outlook of next season. "Those coming back next year carry the perspective and mindset that we formed this season."

"With Wyatt Meade being our only senior, we still have talent and experience coming back for next season, where everyone knows what it takes. There are a lot of guys that wrestle in the offseason and all come in hungry and ready to work hard when it comes to time to wrestle on our mat again," Coach Mike Hamilton said on the outlook of next season.

- Co-MAC league girls' champions (shared with Oxford-Greene) with a 42-6 record
- Finished second in Section IV, Class B.
- Finished third at state qualifiers with a final score of a 7693.
- Had Shelby Rose qualify for the Section IV girls' allstar bowling team that went to states.
- "It was our fifth consective MAC championship, "Coach Matt Bleyle said." It was an impressive accomplishment since we graduated a lot of kids last year and talked about just having a goal of getting better and improving throughout the year one day at a time. " My goal was for us to finish second in the league and no worse and with sharing the league, we automatically qualified for state qualifiers."

"I was able to put girls in and give everyone experience, especially my seventh graders, who stepped up to the plate and were comfortable," Ross added. "This group of girls were not nervous and are looking forward to next year to develop more. I'm hoping that they all come back and even bowl in the summer, which some do, so we should be fairly strong next year."

Ross on his lone senior, Lily Baxter:

"Lily is an absolute sweetheart," Ross said. "She is never in a bad mood and one of the easiest people that I've ever coached. She is in her own little happy world and can be silly at times, where she does throw gutterballs every now and then. Overall, I wish she could have bowled more for us because she has that natural form that I tell the girls to watch and is a great role model as well."



" She has been working really hard, staying active, and pushing herself. She is also working hard on trying to break the 300 meter record and she'll get it if she stays consistent in her training, which she is always serious about."

- Achieved 100th career win in February 2023 and achieved 150th career win in December 2024.
- 2025 Sectional Champion and a 5x Sectional place finisher
- Finished sixth at NYSPHSAA Division II Championships- overall a 2x States place finisher.

"Wyatt was our only senior this season, where I was glad that we were able to host the Section IV State qualifiers at UV and honor him. He has matured a lot since the seventh grade," Coach Mike Hamilton said. "He was a big team leader, even with handling and battling a lot of injuries and adversity throughout his career. He was big part to our team, where he held people accountable and worked hard."

Abdul-Jamil ZaggoutSophomore

- Finished 2024-25 season with a 42-13 record with 30 pins and outscored opponents 234-58.
- Achieved 100th career win on January 18 at the Hoosick Falls Duals.
- Finished second at Sectionals.

"Abul-Jamil has a lot of potential and it was his first time placing and punching his ticket to states," Coach Mike Hamilton said. "He worked hard and wrestled up for us a lot this season to take on tougher guys and really stepped up for the team. I hope he keeps working hard."

- Finished 2024-25 season with a 47-8 record with 26 pins, outscored opponents 244-29.
- Achieved 100th career win in first match wrestled at NYSPHSAA championships.
- Finished second at Sectionals
- Finished seventh at NYSPHSAA Division II Championships.

"It was exciting to watch him hit his 100th career win milestone in the first match at states," Coach Mike Hamilton said. "He is a great leader to the younger kids.
